An Act relating to the tenure of office of Francis Heath Gallagher as the Coal Industry Tribunal and member of the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Commission; for this purpose to amend the Coal Industry Act, 1946, as amended by subsequent Acts; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Coal Industry (Amendment) Act, 1957".

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to make provision whereby Francis Heath Gallagher will be able to hold office as a member of the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Commission and as the person appointed to constitute the Coal Industry Tribunal.
