## GLENBAWN DAM (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1957.

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### EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to amend the Glenbawn Dam Act, 1946, to authorise the location of the spillway of the Dam in a remote saddle in lieu of immediately adjacent to the Dam as provided for in the Glenbawn Dam Act, 1946, with a consequent increase in the capacity of the Dam from about 120,000 acre feet of water to about 296,000 acre feet of water and to authorise the alteration of the purpose of the Dam from a water conserving storage to the combined purposes of flood mitigation and water conservation.
