EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are-

- (1) to amend the provisions of the Motor Traffic Act, 1909, as amended by subsequent Acts, in relation to the limitation of time for which drivers of certain vehicles may remain continuously on duty—
 - (a) to enable regulations to be made prescribing all matters necessary or convenient to be prescribed for the purpose of carrying such provisions into effect and, in particular, dealing with the records to be kept by owners and drivers;
 - (b) to provide that, as well as members of the Police Force, persons authorised by the Commissioner for Motor Transport may, for any purpose pursuant to such provisions, require a motor vehicle driver to stop the vehicle, produce his driver's license, state his name and address and furnish such information as may reasonably be required;
- (2) to make provision for increases in certain fees payable under the Motor Traffic Act, 1909, and the Transport Act, 1930, as amended by subsequent Acts.


