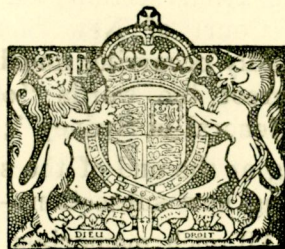

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to authorise the transfer from the Supreme Court to the Registrar-General's Office of certain memorials containing information as to the names of the President and Vice-President of the Newcastle Tattersall's Club.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The Newcastle Tattersall's Club, which was established in 1854, is a club for the purpose of promoting the breeding and training of horses for racing. The club has a long and distinguished history and has been successful in producing many champions. The club's funds are derived from the proceeds of the sale of its horses and from the subscription fees of its members. The club's income is used for the maintenance of its premises and for the expenses of its racing operations. The club's assets are held in trust for the benefit of its members and their families. The club's constitution is contained in its bye-laws, which are subject to the approval of the Secretary of State. The club's members are entitled to elect a committee of management, which is responsible for the day-to-day running of the club. The club's committee of management is currently composed of 12 members, including the club's president and secretary.
