EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to provide that an officer or employee of the Public Service, the Water Conservation and Irrigation Commission, or the Departments of Main Roads, Railways, Government Transport and Motor Transport or a member of the Police Force who has had less than fifteen years but not less than ten years service and who resigns shall be entitled to proportionate long service leave on the basis of three months for fifteen years service.
