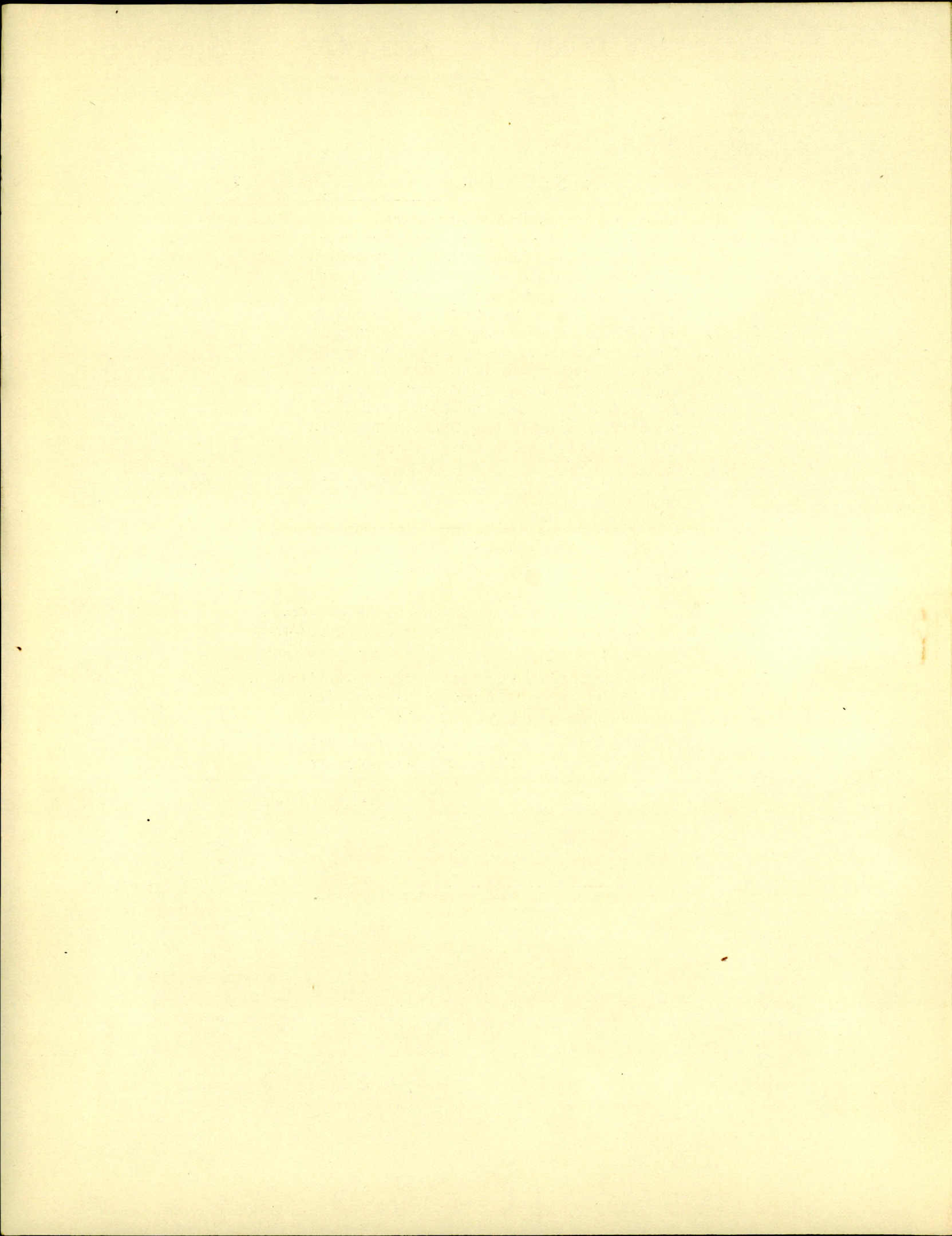

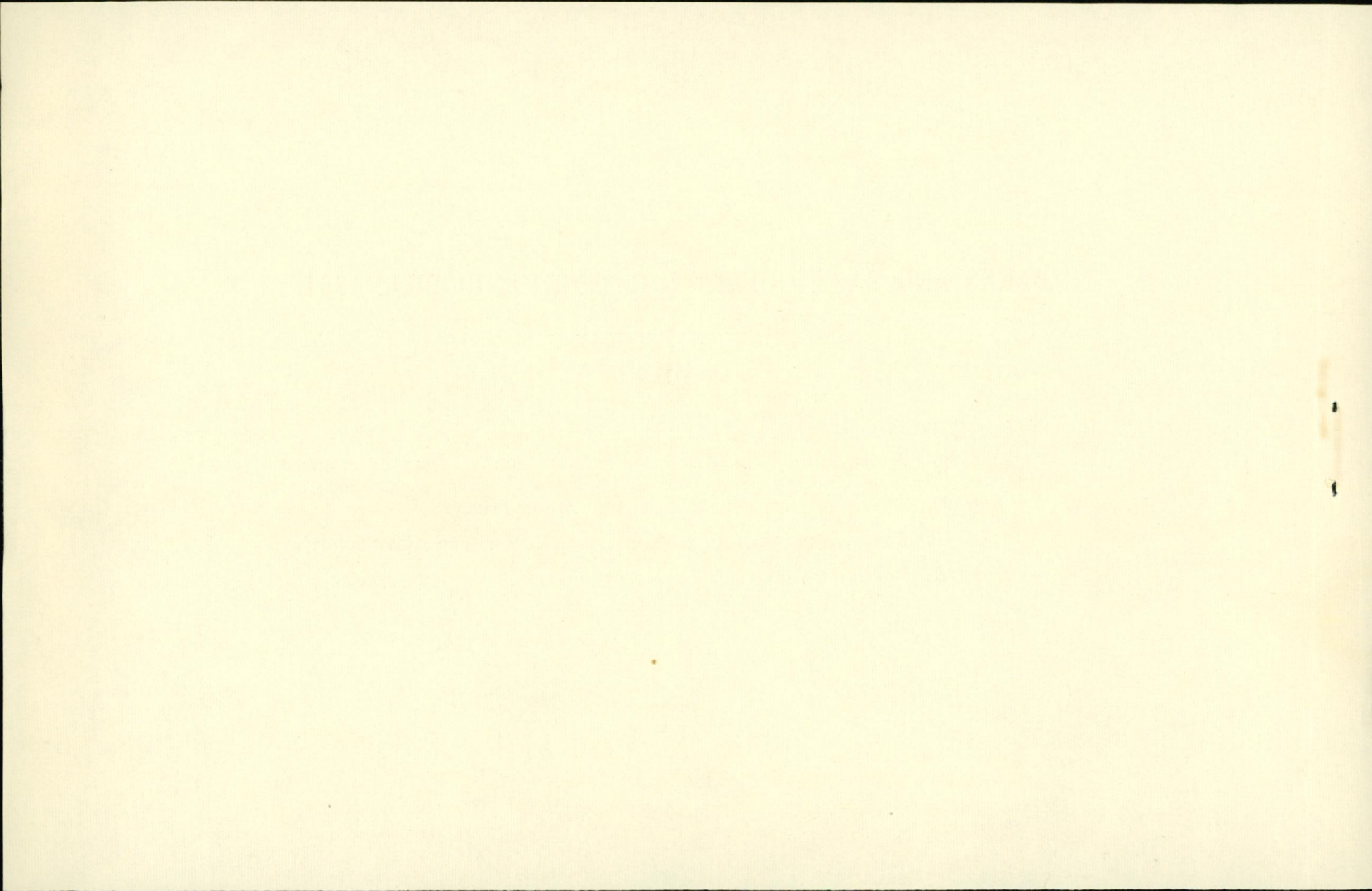


BANKS AND BANK HOLIDAYS (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1961.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to provide that Saturdays shall be bank holidays as on and from a proclaimed day, such day not to be proclaimed until the Governor is satisfied that banks will remain open until five o'clock p.m. on Fridays;
- (b) to authorise the declaration of parts of special days as public half-holidays;
- (c) to make other provisions ancillary to or consequent upon the foregoing.

ARTICLE I

SECTION 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 1. The legislative power shall be vested in the Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

Section 3. The Senate shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for a Term of six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators in that State.

Section 4. The Times, Places and Manner of holding the Elections of Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law alter or add to the Rules and Regulations of the foregoing Elections.

Section 5. The Congress shall assemble at least once in every Year, and such Meeting shall begin on the first Monday in December, but they may adjourn from time to time, and may designate another Day.
