Act No. 23, 1961.

An Act to provide for the refund to members of the Police Force, upon their resignation, dismissal or discharge, of amounts deducted from their salaries for payment to the Police Superannuation and Reward Fund; for this purpose to amend the Police Regulation Act, 1899–1960; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 27th March, 1961.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Police Regulation Short title (Amendment) Act, 1961".

(2) The Police Regulation Act, 1899, as amended by subsequent Acts and by this Act, may be cited as the Police Regulation Act, 1899-1961.

Amendment of Act No. 20, 1899. New sec. 29a. 2. The Police Regulation Act, 1899-1960, is amended by inserting next after section twenty-nine the following new section:—

Refund of deductions.

- 29A. (1) Where a member of the police force appointed under this Act resigns, or is dismissed or discharged, from the police force there shall, irrespective of the cause of his resignation, dismissal or discharge, be paid to him from the Police Superannuation and Reward Fund a lump sum equal to the difference between—
  - (a) the amount deducted under this Act from the pay and salary of such member (but without any addition by way of interest or dividends); and
  - (b) any amount received by such member as pension or gratuity before his resignation, dismissal or discharge.

The amount payable to a member of the police force under this subsection shall not be less than the amount of deductions made from his pay and salary since any amount was last received by him under this Act as pension or gratuity.

(2) Where any member of the police force appointed under this Act, who has resigned, or has been dismissed or discharged, from the police force and has received the amount payable to him under subsection one of this section, is thereafter re-appointed to the police force, he shall not be entitled to claim any further benefit from the Police Superannuation and Reward Fund in respect of his previous service in the police force unless such amount is repaid to the Police Superannuation and Reward Fund before his re-appointment to the police force.

Amendment of Act No. 20, 1899. New sec. 29A. 2. The Police Regulation Act, 1899-1960, is amended by inserting next after section twenty-nine the following new section:—

Refund of deductions.

- 29A. (1) Where a member of the police force appointed under this Act resigns, or is dismissed or discharged, from the police force there shall, irrespective of the cause of his resignation, dismissal or discharge, be paid to him from the Police Superannuation and Reward Fund a lump sum equal to the difference between—
  - (a) the amount deducted under this Act from the pay and salary of such member (but without any addition by way of interest or dividends); and
  - (b) any amount received by such member as pension or gratuity before his resignation, dismissal or discharge.

The amount payable to a member of the police force under this subsection shall not be less than the amount of deductions made from his pay and salary since any amount was last received by him under this Act as pension or gratuity.

(2) Where any member of the police force appointed under this Act, who has resigned, or has been dismissed or discharged, from the police force and has received the amount payable to him under subsection one of this section, is thereafter re-appointed to the police force, he shall not be entitled to claim any further benefit from the Police Superannuation and Reward Fund in respect of his previous service in the police force unless such amount is repaid to the Police Superannuation and Reward Fund before his re-appointment to the police force.
