





EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to increase as from 1st May, 1960, police pensions under £456 per annum;
- (b) to provide that the pension of police retiring medically unfit should begin on the date that extended leave, if taken, would have commenced;
