SWINE COMPENSATION TAXATION BILL, 1959.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to provide for the payment of stamp duty in respect of the delivery of pigs to an abattoir for slaughter at the rate of 6d. per pig in lieu of the present rate of duty of 1s. per pig.
