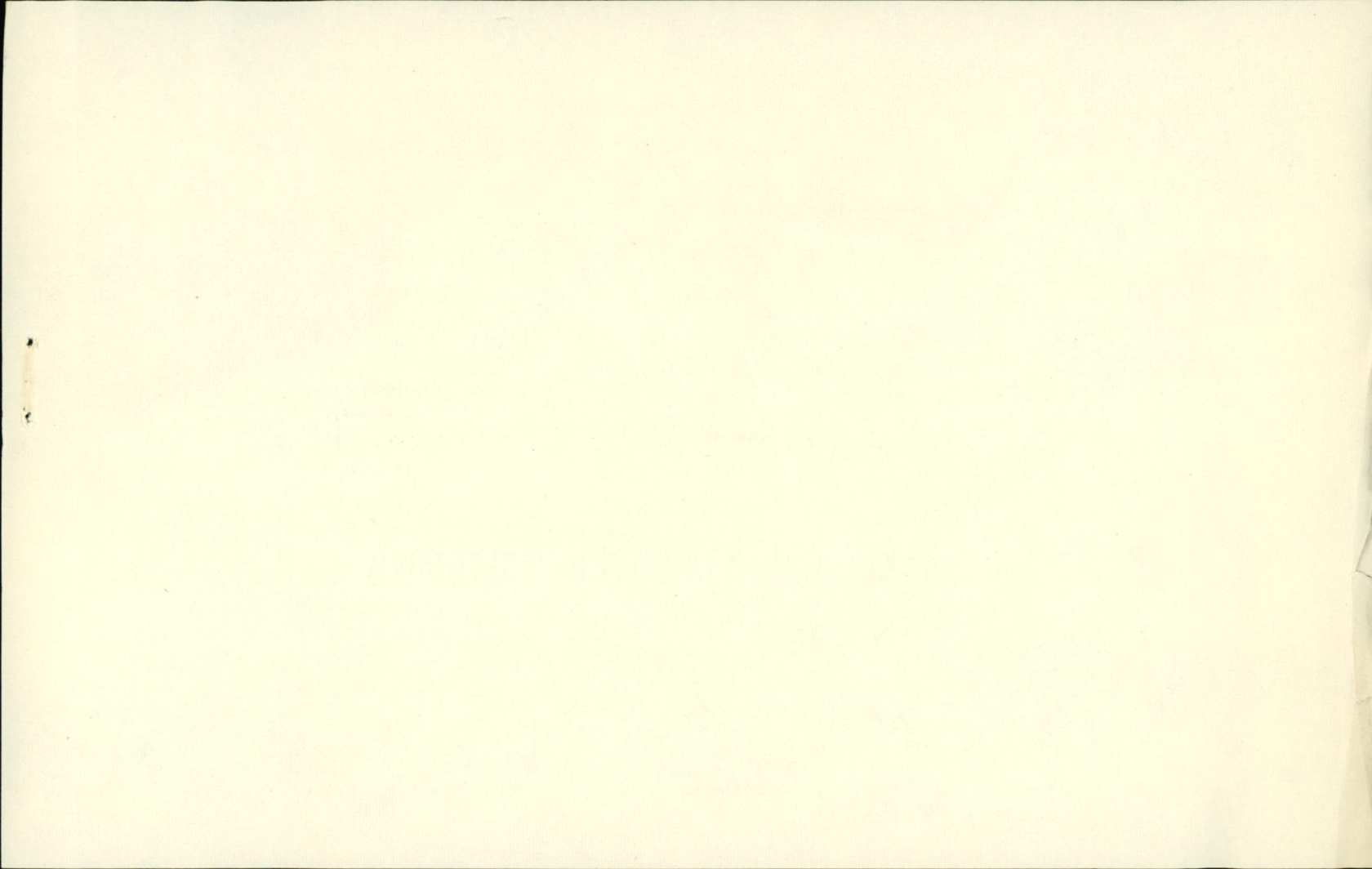

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to extend the power conferred by the Weights and Measures Act, 1915-1956, to make regulations relating to the packaging of goods in standard packs.
