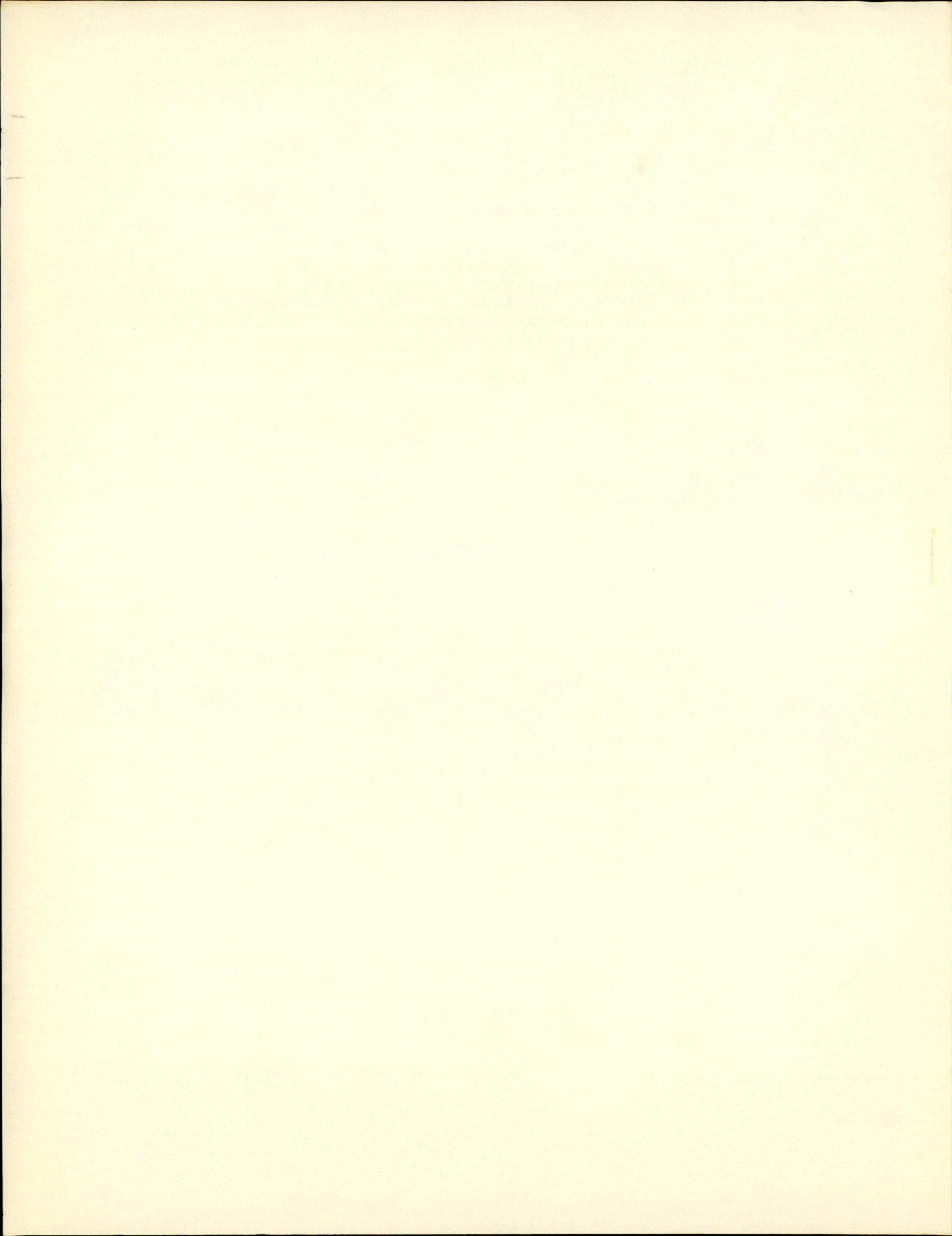

### **EXPLANATORY NOTE.**

THE object of this Bill is to empower the Governor to make regulations under the Book Purchasers' Protection Act, 1899, as amended, including regulations prescribing the size of type to be used in setting out the book purchaser's total liability.

BOOK PURCHASERS' PROTECTION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1973

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Bill provides for the protection of book purchasers by enabling them to return books to the seller if they are not satisfied with the purchase. It also provides for the refund of the purchase price and the return of the book to the seller.

### **EXPLANATORY NOTE.**

BOOK PURCHASERS' PROTECTION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1903.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

The Bill is intended to amend the Book Purchasers' Protection Act, 1902, in order to give effect to the recommendations of the Royal Commission on the subject of the sale of books, which were published in 1901. The Bill is divided into three parts, the first of which contains the amendments to the Act, the second part contains the provisions relating to the sale of books, and the third part contains the provisions relating to the sale of newspapers and periodicals.
