BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

Book Publishers' Provision (Amended)

It shall be the duty of the publisher of any book, pamphlet, or other printed matter, to deposit with the clerk of the court, in the office of the clerk of the court, a copy of the same, in the original and in duplicate, within a reasonable time after the date of its publication, and to pay to the clerk of the court the fee thereon, as provided in section 35 of this act.

BOOK PURCHASERS' PROTECTION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1963.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to empower the Governor to make regulations under the Book Purchasers' Protection Act, 1899, as amended, including regulations prescribing the size of type to be used in setting out the book purchaser's total liability.

BOOK PURCHASERS' PROTECTION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1963

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Bill amends the Book Purchasers' Protection Act, 1958, to provide for the protection of book purchasers in the event of the liquidation of a bookseller.
