

An Act to make further provisions relating to the registration of dentists; to constitute a Dentists Charges Committee and to define its powers and functions; for these and other purposes to amend the Dentists Act, 1934–1957; and for purposes connected therewith.

B^E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Dentists (Amend-Short title, citation and commencement.

- (2) The Dentists Act, 1934, as amended by subsequent Acts and by this Act, may be cited as the Dentists Act, 1934-1964.
- (3) This Act shall commence upon a day to be 5 appointed by the Governor and notified by proclamation published in the Gazette.

- (2) The Board may refuse to register the name of any person who is otherwise entitled to be registered but—
 - (a) who has in New South Wales been convicted of a felony or misdemeanour or elsewhere of any offence which if committed in New South Wales would have been a felony or misdemeanour; or
 - (b) whose name has been erased or removed from any register or roll established or kept under any law in any country providing for the registration or certification of dentists under a public authority; or
 - (c) who is a mentally ill person, a protected person, or an incapable person, within the meaning of the Mental Health Act, 1958. as amended by subsequent Acts, or is a habitual drunkard or is habitually addicted to any drug to which Part VI of the Police Offences (Amendment) Act, 1908, applies.

The Board shall not refuse to register the name of any person on the ground specified in paragraph (a) of this subsection when the offence was not from its trivial nature or from the circumstances under which it was committed such as to render such person unfit in the public interest to practise his profession, or on the ground specified in paragraph (b) of this subsection unless the reason for such erasing or removal was an act or omission of a nature affecting his conduct in any professional respect for which, if done or omitted to be done in New South Wales, the Board would have been authorised under section eight of this Act to remove the name of such person from the dentists' register, if registered therein.

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- (3) No person shall be registered or licensed under this Act unless he proves to the satisfaction of the Board that he has a knowledge of the English language adequate for the conduct of the practice of dentistry, as a registered person or as the holder of a license.

The members present at a meeting shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

- (4) (a) The party chargeable may within three months after service upon him of a bill apply in the prescribed manner to the Committee to review the same.

 - (a) the time occupied in performing and the nature of the dental treatment rendered;
 - (b) the distance between the consulting room or residence of the dentist and the place at which he rendered the dental treatment;
 - (c) the hours of the day or night at which such dental treatment was rendered;
 - (d) the degree of skill, knowledge or experience required or given in the rendering of such dental treatment;
 - (e) whether the dentist rendered such dental treatment in the capacity of specialist, consultant or dentist in ordinary practice;
 - (f) any other matter which to the Committee appears relevant.


DENTISTS (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1963.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to provide for the appointment of an additional member to the Dental Board;
- (b) to provide that any vacancy in the office of an elected member of the Dental Board may be filled by appointment by the Governor;
- (c) to provide that each member of the Dental Board, if he is not a Public Servant, shall be paid such fees as may be determined by the Governor;
- (d) to require the Registrar of the Dental Board to have printed and published, as soon as practicable in each year, a list of the names and addresses of registered dentists;
- (e) to remove the restriction on the amount of roll fee required to be paid by registered dentists each year;
- (f) to do away with the necessity for notifications concerning non-payment of the prescribed roll fee by registered dentists to be sent by registered letter;
- (g) to exclude from a charge of "misconduct in a professional respect", a registered dentist who for fee, salary or other reward is employed by or associates himself with a council within the meaning of the Local Government Act, 1919, as amended, in carrying on the practice of dentistry;
- (h) to provide for an appeal to a District Court instead of the Supreme Court, by any person aggrieved by the actions of the Dental Board in his case;
- (i) to vary the provisions relating to the registration of persons to practise dentistry;
- (j) to enable the practice of a deceased dentist to be carried on under certain conditions;
- (k) to provide for the establishment of a Dentists Charges Committee for the purpose of reviewing charges made by registered dentists;

- (b) Where an application is made pursuant to paragraph (a) of this subsection to review a bill, the Committee shall proceed to review the bill and certify what, upon such review, is found to be a reasonable charge or remuneration in respect of the dental treatment to which the bill relates.

(c) The Committee may require such evidence to be furnished as it may think necessary or desirable for the purpose of such review and may fix a time within which such evidence shall be furnished.

If any person neglects or fails to furnish any evidence so required within the time so fixed, the Committee may proceed to review the bill without such evidence.

- (5) In the review of any bill, the Committee shall have regard to the following matters—
 - (a) the time occupied in performing and the nature of the dental treatment rendered;
 - (b) the distance between the consulting room or residence of the dentist and the place at which he rendered the dental treatment;
 - (c) the hours of the day or night at which such dental treatment was rendered;
 - (d) the degree of skill, knowledge or experience required or given in the rendering of such dental treatment;
 - (e) whether the dentist rendered such dental treatment in the capacity of specialist, consultant or dentist in ordinary practice;
 - (f) any other matter which to the Committee appears relevant.
- (6) Subsections three and four of this section shall not apply in any case where the bill is in respect of the costs of medical treatment within the meaning of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1926, as amended by subsequent Acts, being treatment by a dentist or the provision of teeth.
- (7) The certificate of the Committee shall be admissible as evidence in any proceedings for the recovery of the charge or remuneration to which the bill referred to in the certificate relates.
