EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are—

LEGAL ASSISTANCE (ADMINISTRATIVE) BILL, 1911

SECTION 1

1. The following persons shall be deemed to be legal assistants for the purposes of this Act, namely:—
(a) any person who is employed by the Government as a legal assistant;
(b) any person who is employed by a local authority as a legal assistant;
(c) any person who is employed by a public body as a legal assistant;
(d) any person who is employed by a private body as a legal assistant;
(e) any person who is employed by a trade union as a legal assistant;
(f) any person who is employed by a society as a legal assistant;
(g) any person who is employed by a club as a legal assistant;
(h) any person who is employed by a company as a legal assistant;
(i) any person who is employed by a partnership as a legal assistant;
(j) any person who is employed by an individual as a legal assistant.
