**LOCAL GOVERNMENT (PAYMENT OF FEES) AMENDMENT
BILL, 1963.**

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to give councils a discretionary power to pay to their members fees (not exceeding £250 for any member in any one year) in respect of meetings and committee meetings they attend or whilst they are engaged on inspections or other council business.
