MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1964.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to amend the provisions of the Medical Practitioners (Amendment) Act, 1963, relating to the reconstitution of the New South Wales Medical Board so that they will conform with the corresponding provisions of the Medical Practitioners Act, 1938, as amended by subsequent Acts ;
- (b) to increase the quorum required at a meeting of the New South Wales Medical Board from six to seven members ;
- (c) to provide that the fee payable for the issue of a certificate of regional registration shall be as prescribed ;
- (d) to empower the New South Wales Medical Board to refuse to restore to the register the name of a person in certain circumstances, and to confer on a person, whose application for restoration of his name to the register has been refused, a right of appeal to the Supreme Court ;
- (e) to vary the Schedules set forth in the Medical Practitioners (Amendment) Act, 1963, and to incorporate them in the Medical Practitioners Act, 1938, as amended by subsequent Acts ;
- (f) to make other amendments of a minor or ancillary nature.

MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1964

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Bill amends the Medical Practitioners Act, 1954, in relation to the registration of medical practitioners and the regulation of their conduct. It provides for the inclusion of certain classes of medical practitioners who are not currently registered under the Act, and for the establishment of a new body to regulate the medical profession. The Bill also provides for the amendment of the provisions relating to the suspension and revocation of the registration of medical practitioners.

The Bill is divided into three parts. Part I contains the amendments to the Medical Practitioners Act, 1954. Part II contains the provisions relating to the establishment of the new body, and Part III contains the provisions relating to the suspension and revocation of the registration of medical practitioners.

The Bill is intended to bring the law relating to the medical profession in line with the provisions of the Constitution of India, and to provide for the better regulation of the medical profession.
