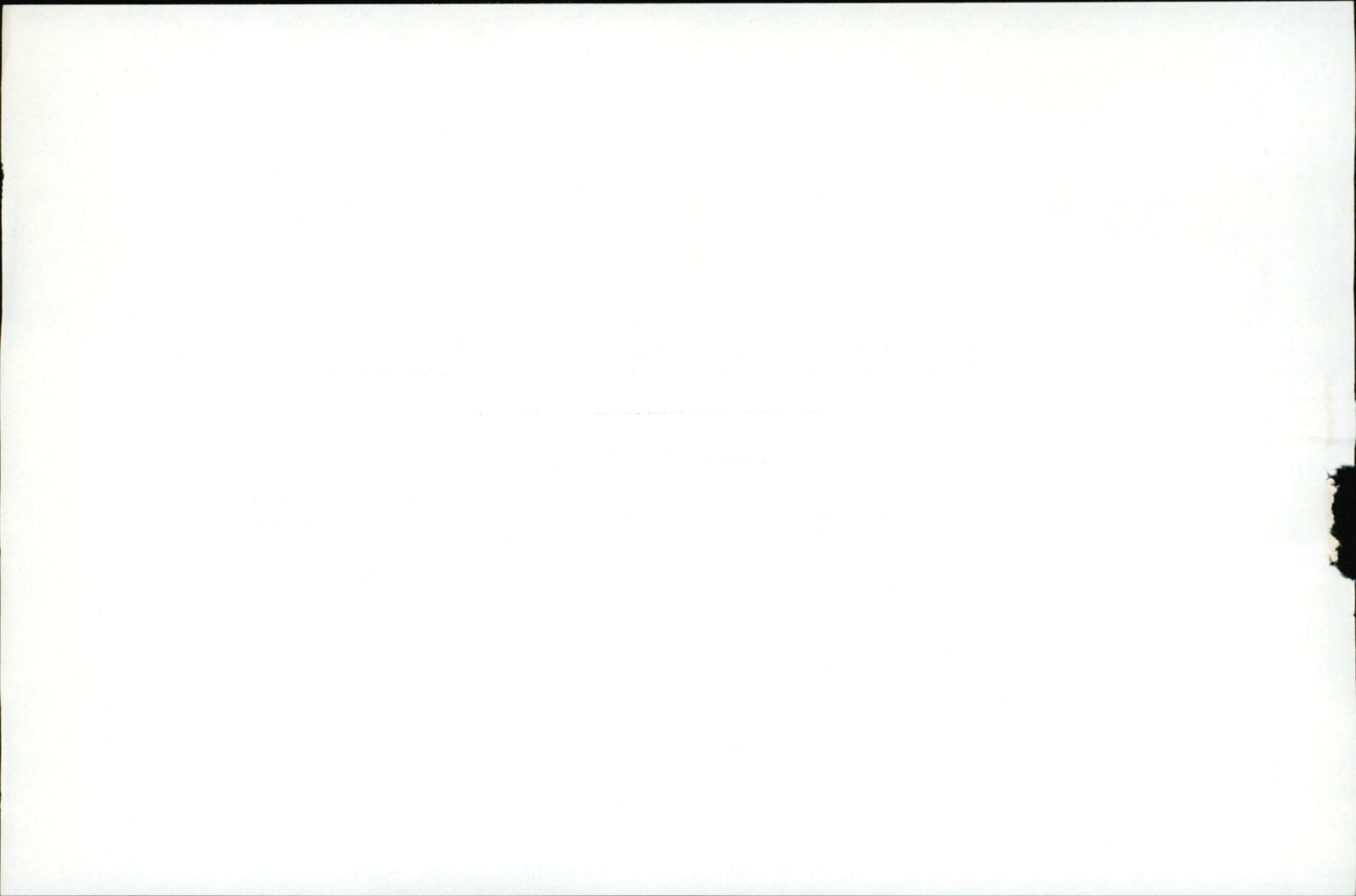

POLICE REGULATION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1963.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE object of this Bill is to prohibit a member of the police force who has been promoted after his 58th birthday from taking, except in a special case, any extended leave during the period of 12 months following his promotion.
