

Further amendment of Sydney Grammar School Act, 1854-1940. New sec. 17. **4.** The Sydney Grammar School Act, 1854-1940, is further amended by inserting at the end thereof the following new section:—

Accounts and audit. 17. The said Trustees shall once in every year prepare a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the said School during the last preceding calendar year and a balance sheet as at the end of that calendar year and shall cause such statement and balance sheet to be audited by a registered public accountant who shall be required to report to the said Trustees as to whether in his opinion the statement and balance sheet give a true and fair view of the state of the affairs of the said School. Copies of the audited statement of receipts and expenditure and balance sheet and of the auditor's report shall be furnished to the Attorney-General and to each of the said Trustees.
