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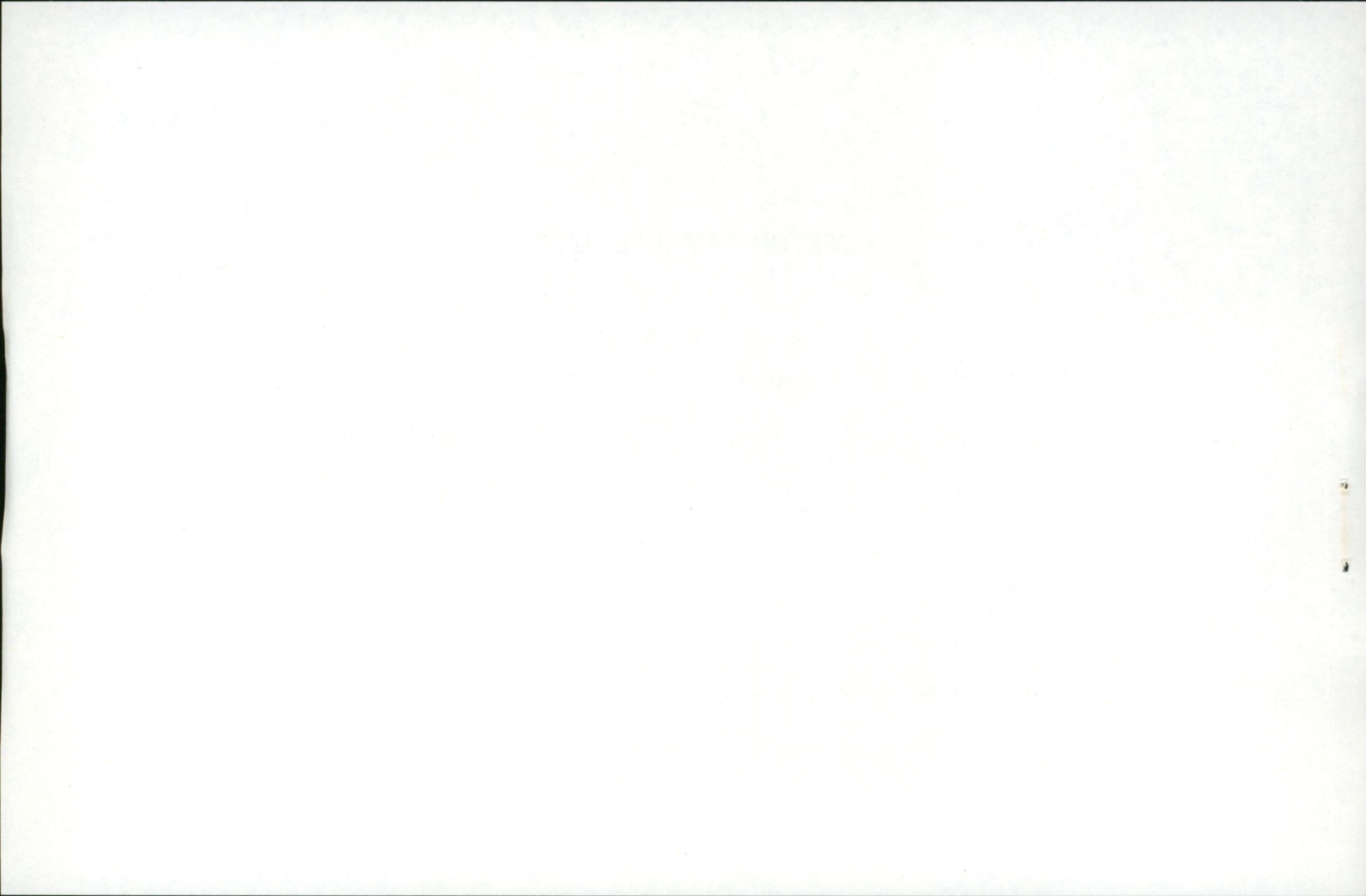
### EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE Bill sanctions and provides for the construction of—

- (a) a rock-fill dam across the Gwydir River about 5 miles west of the village of Copeton of a height sufficient to store about 1,100,000 acre-feet of water for irrigation purposes ;
- (b) necessary spillways and gates and outlet works for regulation of the discharge of water from the storage.

The Bill provides that the work shall be deemed an authorised work within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, and that The Water Conservation and Irrigation Commission shall be the Constructing Authority for the work.

The estimated cost of the work is forty-five million dollars.
