Act No. , 1966.

An Act to authorise the grant of certificates of provisional registration entitling persons to practise as dentists; for this and other purposes to amend the Dentists Act, 1934, as amended by subsequent Acts; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Dentists (Amendment) Act, 1966".

(2) The Dentists Act, 1934, as amended by subsequent Acts and by this Act, may be cited as the Dentists Act, 1934-1966.

2. (1) The Dentists Act, 1934, as amended by 5 subsequent Acts, is amended— Amendment of Act No. 10, 1934.

(a) by inserting next after subsection two of section five the following new subsections:— Sec. 5. (Appointments.)

10 (3) Upon complaint made by an inspector on oath before a justice that the inspector suspects or believes that any of the provisions of this Act or of the regulations have been or are being contravened, and upon reasonable grounds being shown in such complaint for the inspector so suspecting or believing, that justice may grant a search warrant authorising that inspector, at any time or times within one month from the date of the warrant to enter the premises named in the warrant and to make such enquiries therein as such inspector may think fit.

20 (4) A person shall not wilfully delay or obstruct an inspector in the exercise of his powers under this section.

may, on behalf of the Board and on payment of the prescribed fee, grant to such person a certificate of provisional registration in the prescribed form.

15 (2) Where a person has obtained a certificate of provisional registration he shall be deemed to be registered under this Act until—

- (a) the date stated in such certificate as the date upon which the certificate expires; or
- 20 (b) such later date as is fixed by the Board, which in no case shall be later than three months from the granting of such certificate :

25 Provided that if the Board, before the date so stated or fixed, has reason to believe that such person is not entitled to be registered, it may, without prejudice to his application to be registered, cancel such certificate; and such person shall thereupon cease to be deemed to be registered.

30 (3) If a person to whom a certificate of provisional registration has been granted becomes registered under this Act, his registration shall, unless otherwise decided by the Board, date from the granting of such certificate.

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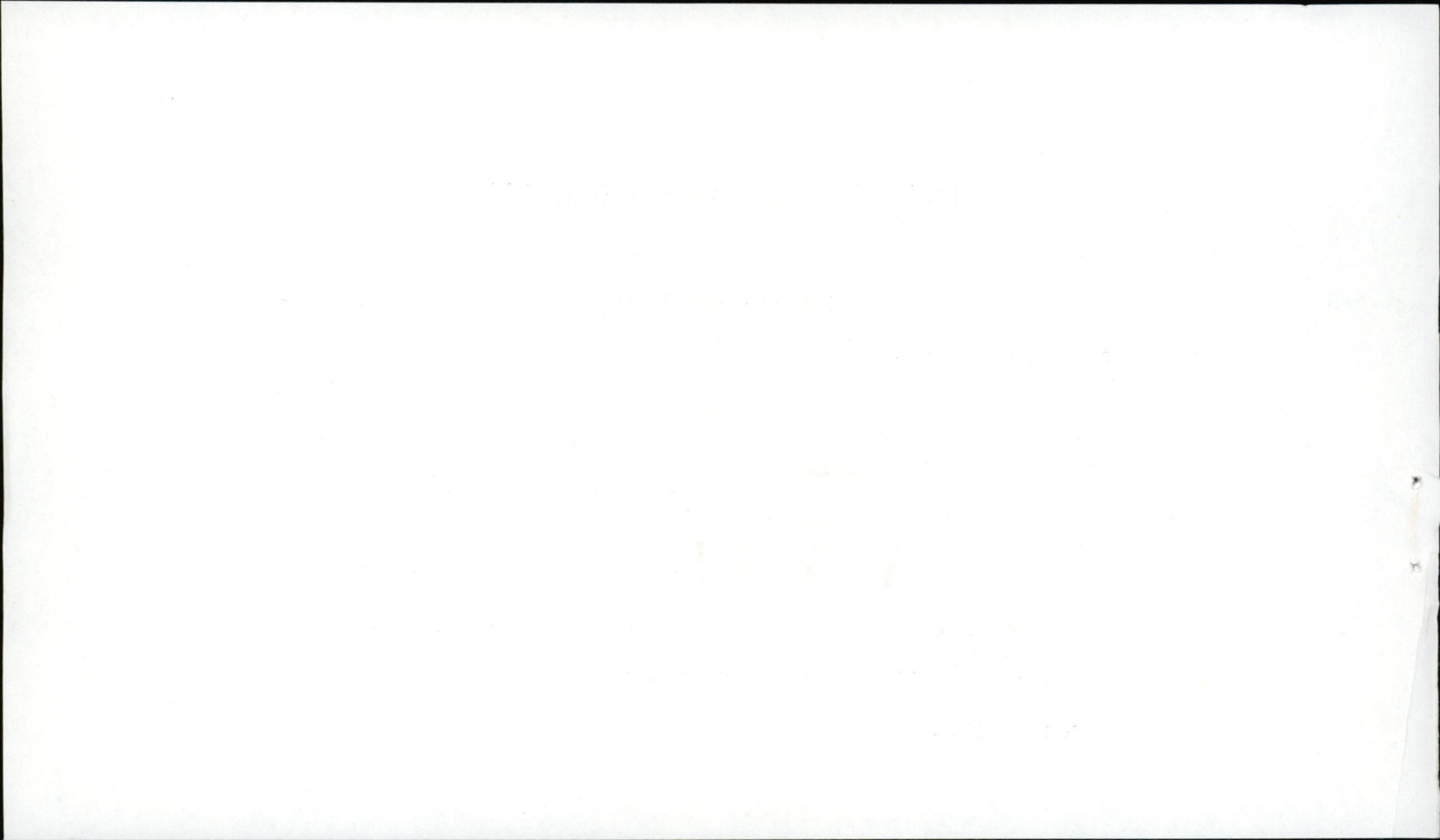

DENTISTS (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1966.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to extend the powers of entry and search conferred on inspectors under the Dentists Act, 1934, as amended;
- (b) to provide for the issue of provisional certificates of registration entitling persons to practise dentistry;
- (c) to require prescriptions for the construction or repair of artificial dentures or restorative appliances to be in writing;
- (d) to authorise the making of regulations with respect to—
 - (i) advertising by friendly societies, councils and certain other bodies and corporations; and
 - (ii) the furnishing to the Board by a dentist or an applicant for registration of evidence of the date of his birth;
- (e) to make provisions ancillary to the foregoing.
