# FACTORIES, SHOPS AND INDUSTRIES AND PHARMACY (AMENDMENT) BILL. 1966

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE object of this Bill is to permit certain classes of chemists' shops, described as "special pharmacies" and "after-hours pharmacies", to be kept open at times when, under the present law, all chemists' shops are required to be closed.


"Special pharmacies" are shops to be registered as such and in which the only goods sold would be medicines or surgical appliances, or those goods together with certain other goods set out in the Bill or to be prescribed by regulations. They will be allowed to be open at all times on all days.

"After-hours pharmacies" are shops selling the same range of goods as special pharmacies but occupied by partnerships formed of the shopkeepers of a prescribed number of ordinary chemists' shops. They will be allowed to be open—

- (a) at all times on Sundays and public holidays, and
- (b) at all times on all other days except between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and except between 9 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. on Saturdays.

The Bill also contains provisions-

- (c) to amend certain provisions of the Pharmacy Act, 1964, as amended, so as to enable partnerships of pharmacists to carry on business in "after-hours pharmacies", and to make provisions in relation to such partnerships;

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows: -

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Factories, Shops Short title, and Industries and Pharmacy (Amendment) Act, 1966".
