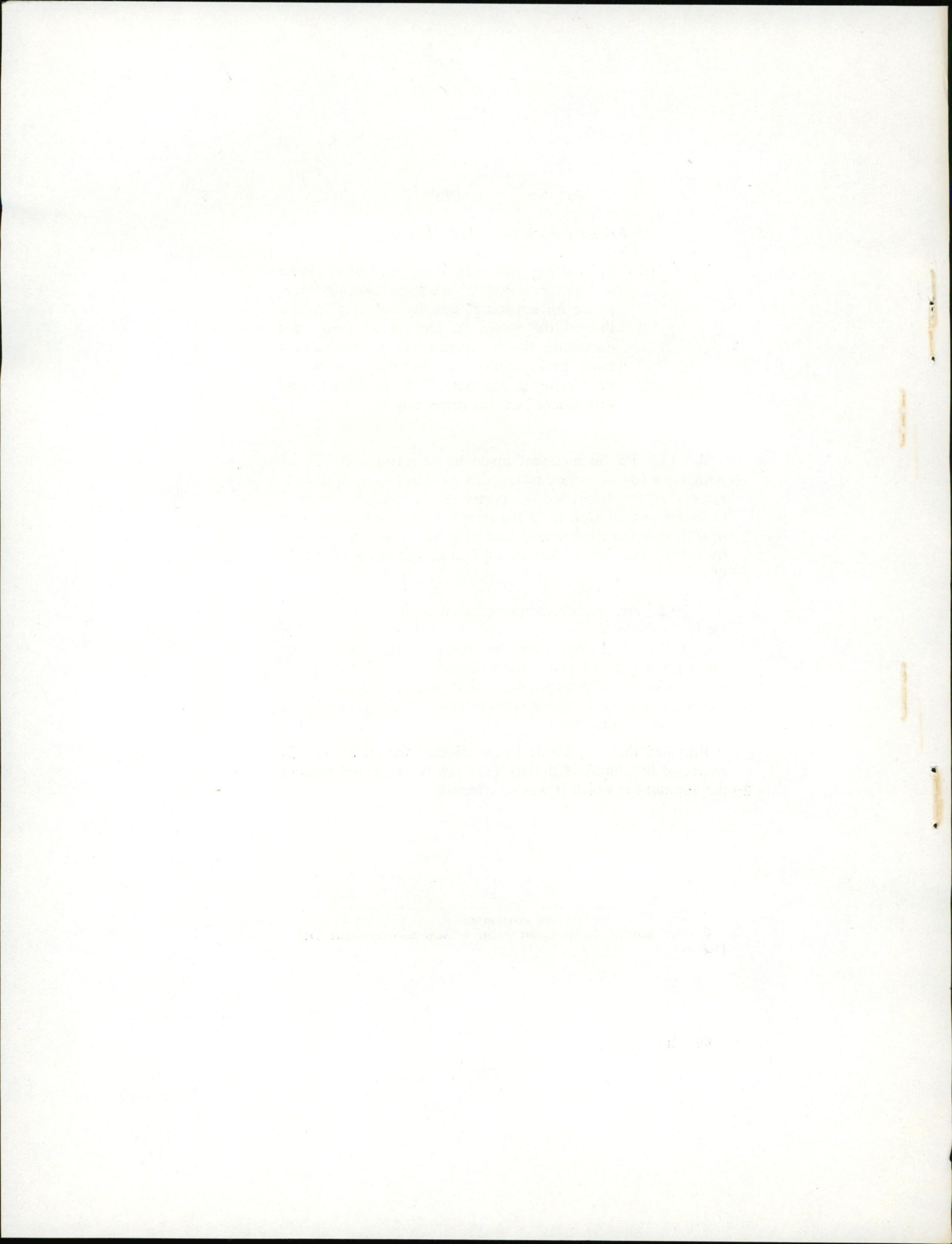

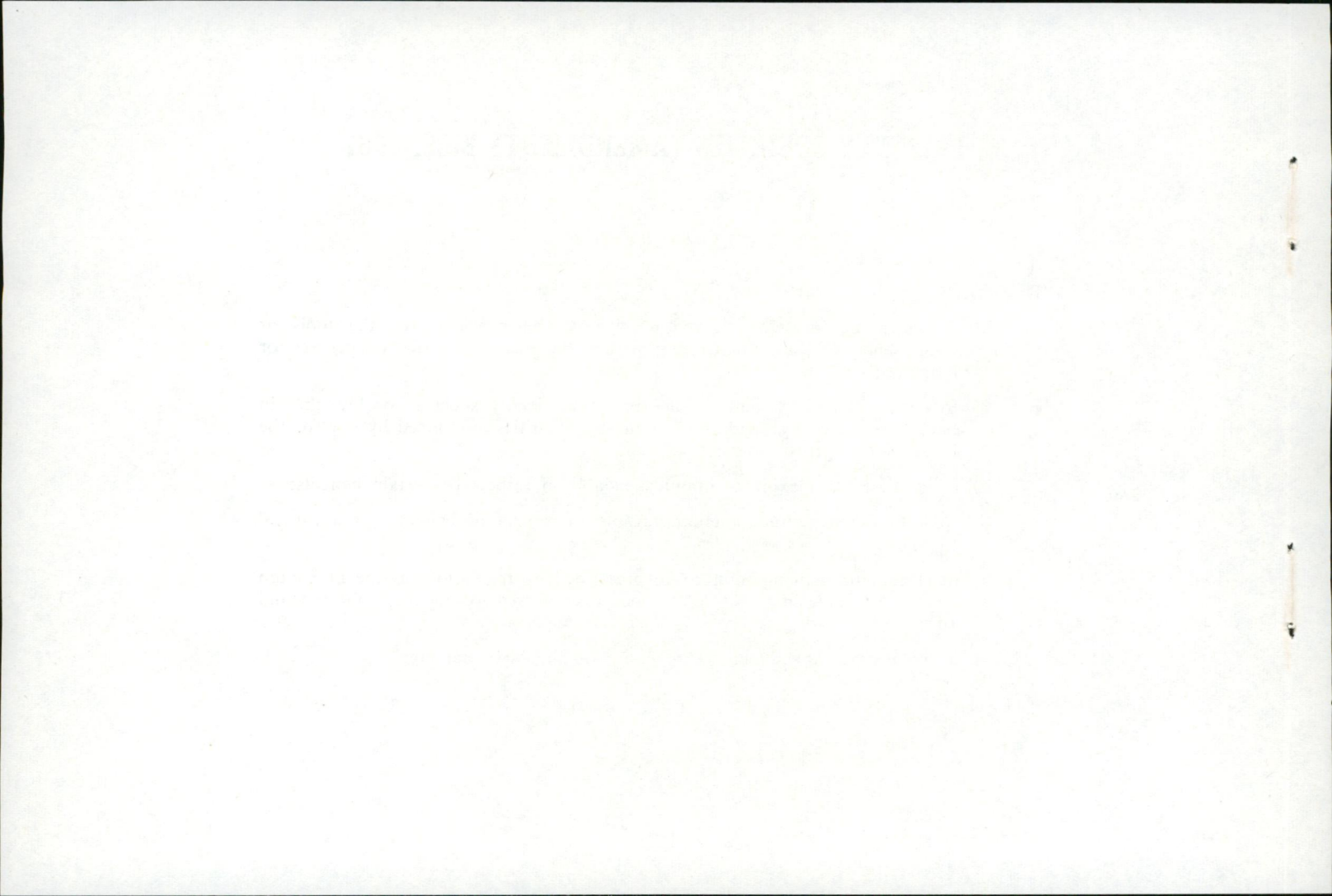


FRIENDLY SOCIETIES (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1967

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to widen the insurance cover which may be provided for the tools or implements of trade or calling of the members of friendly societies or branches;
- (b) to permit the investment of the funds of friendly societies or branches in banks prescribed by regulations or in any securities authorised by law for the investment of trust funds;
- (c) to increase the maximum amounts payable in respect of certain benefits;
- (d) to limit the maximum amount payable in respect of benefits for a funeral to \$500;
- (e) to permit different amounts to be prescribed by regulations as the maximum amounts payable in respect of the benefits referred to in paragraphs (c) and (d); and
- (f) to make other amendments of a minor or ancillary character.

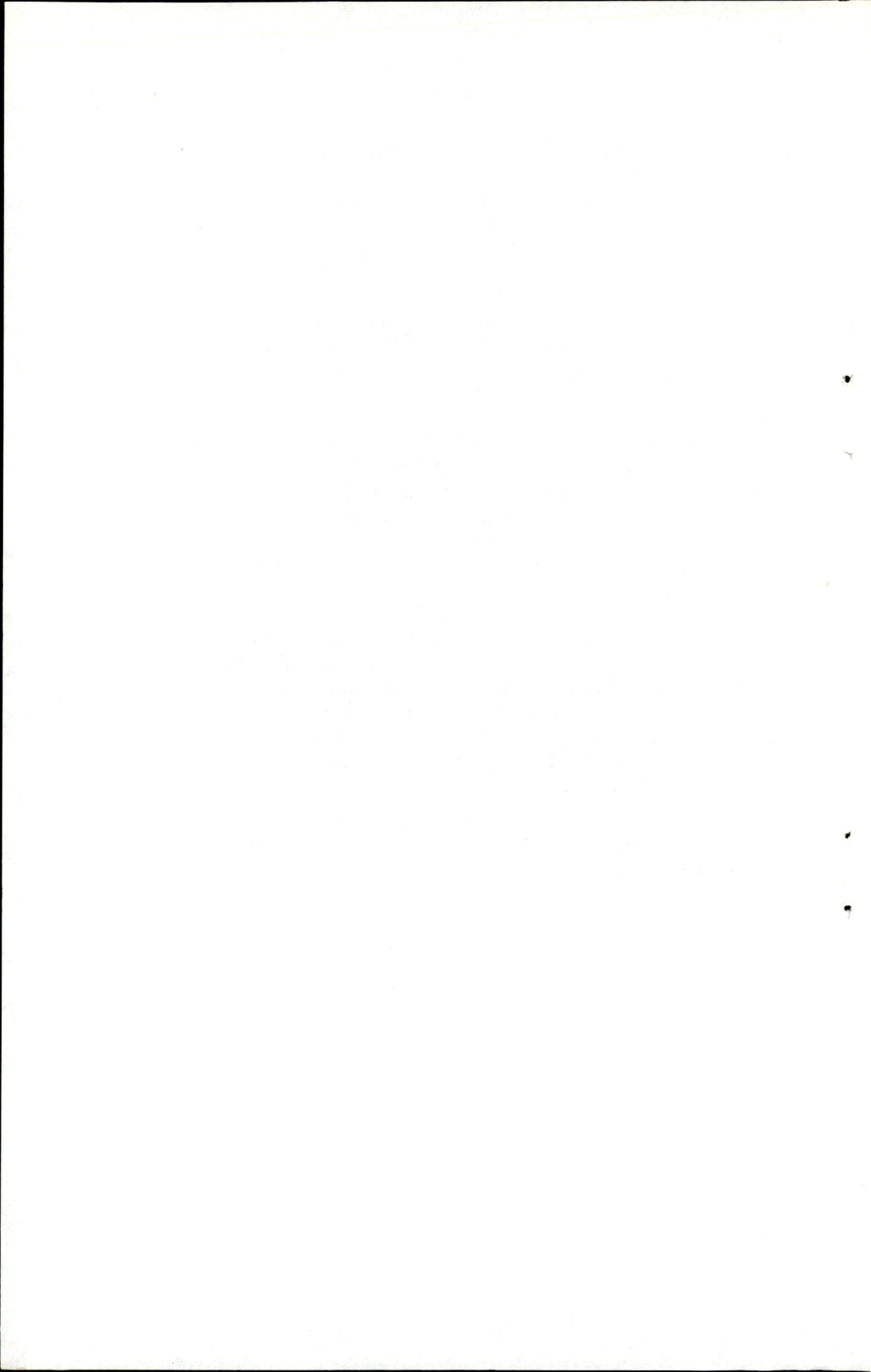

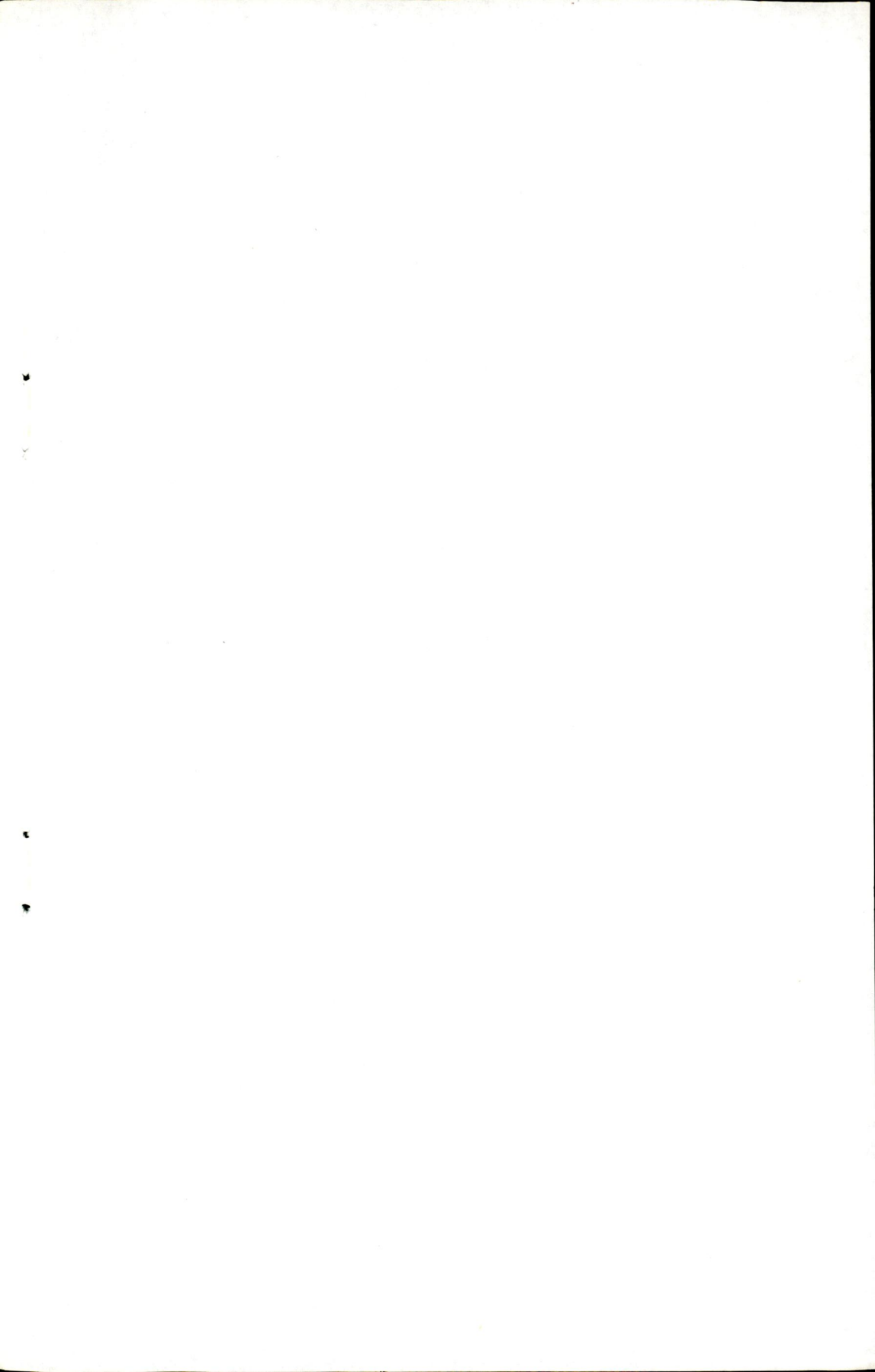

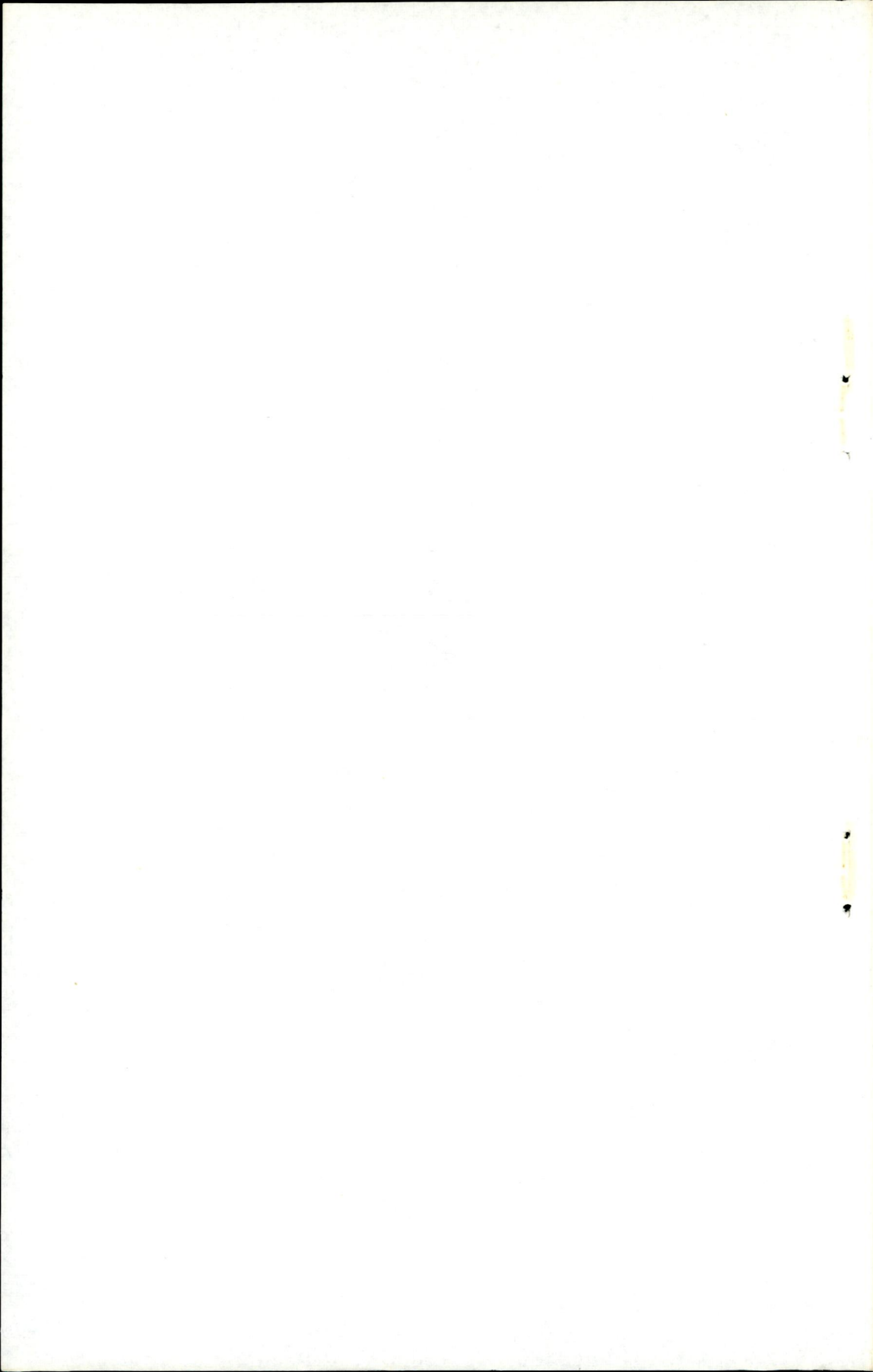
