

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE objects of this Bill are:-

- (c) to increase the rate of pensions payable to contributors who become pensioners after the enactment of this Bill and to provide for allowances to be payable in respect of children under the age of eighteen years;
- (d) to provide that no pension shall be payable where a member ceases to hold office under section 19 or 34 of the Constitution Act;
