AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAWS RELATIVE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

1. The Legislature hereby enacts that the Department of Agriculture shall have the honor and respect due to its office and to its officers and employees.

2. The Department of Agriculture shall be organized as follows: The Department shall consist of a Commissioner and such other officers and employees as may be deemed necessary.

3. The Commissioner of the Department of Agriculture shall be appointed by the Governor and shall hold office for a term of four years. He shall be eligible for reappointment. He shall be a resident of this State and shall be at least thirty years of age at the time of his appointment. He shall be a citizen of the United States. EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to assure the payment of pension to widows of members or pensioners where such member or pensioner is not survived by children under the age of 18 years;
- (b) to provide for the payment to the estate of a contributor of a refund of his contributions to the Legislative Assembly Members Provident Fund, where at the time of his death the contributor is unmarried or is not qualified to receive a pension and is not survived by a widow or children under the age of 18 years ;
- (c) to enable a widow in receipt of a pension upon becoming a member to qualify for a pension in her own right upon the expiration of the period of suspension applicable to her by section 12 (6) of the Legislative Assembly Members Superannuation Act;
- (d) to make other amendments of a machinery character.
