An Act to sanction and to provide for the construction of a dam across the Paterson River about three-quarters of a mile upstream from Lostock and works incidental thereto; to amend the Public Works Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith.

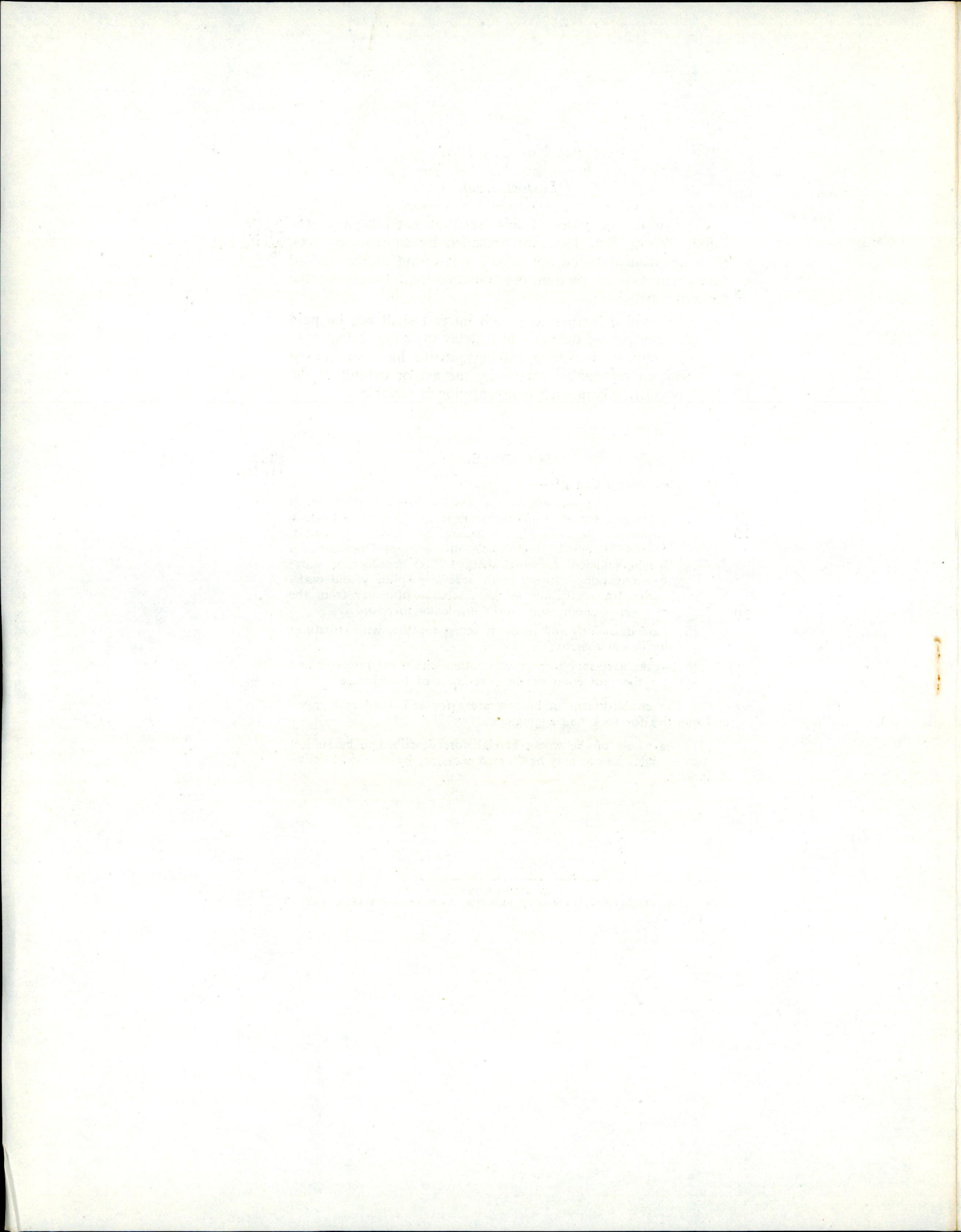

LOSTOCK DAM BILL, 1967

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE Bill sanctions and provides for the construction of—

- (a) an earth and rock-fill dam across the Paterson River about three-quarters of a mile upstream from the town of Lostock of a height sufficient to store about 16,000 acre-feet of water for irrigation purposes ;
- (b) necessary spillway and outlet works for regulation of the discharge of water from the storage.

The Bill provides that the work shall be deemed an authorised work within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, and that The Water Conservation and Irrigation Commission shall be the Constructing Authority for the work.

The estimated cost of the work is seven million five hundred thousand dollars.
