MILK (DECIMAL CURRENCY) BILL, 1965.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are to facilitate the fixation of milk prices to operate on the introduction of decimal currency on 14th February, 1966, by authorising the fixation of those prices without the necessity for first holding the public inquiry required under the provisions of the Milk Act, 1931-1964.

The Bill also makes provision for matters ancillary to and consequential upon the foregoing.
