POLICE OFFENCES (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1965.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to amend the provisions of the Police Offences Act, 1901, as amended by subsequent Acts, which prohibit the use and carrying of firearms on Sundays—
 - (i) to authorise the making of orders exempting certain persons or classes of persons from those provisions;
 - (ii) to increase the penalty from £5 to £50 for contravening those provisions;
 - (iii) to remove the requirement that a prosecution for an offence against those provisions be commenced within ten days after the offence has been committed; and
- (b) to make other provisions of an ancillary nature.
