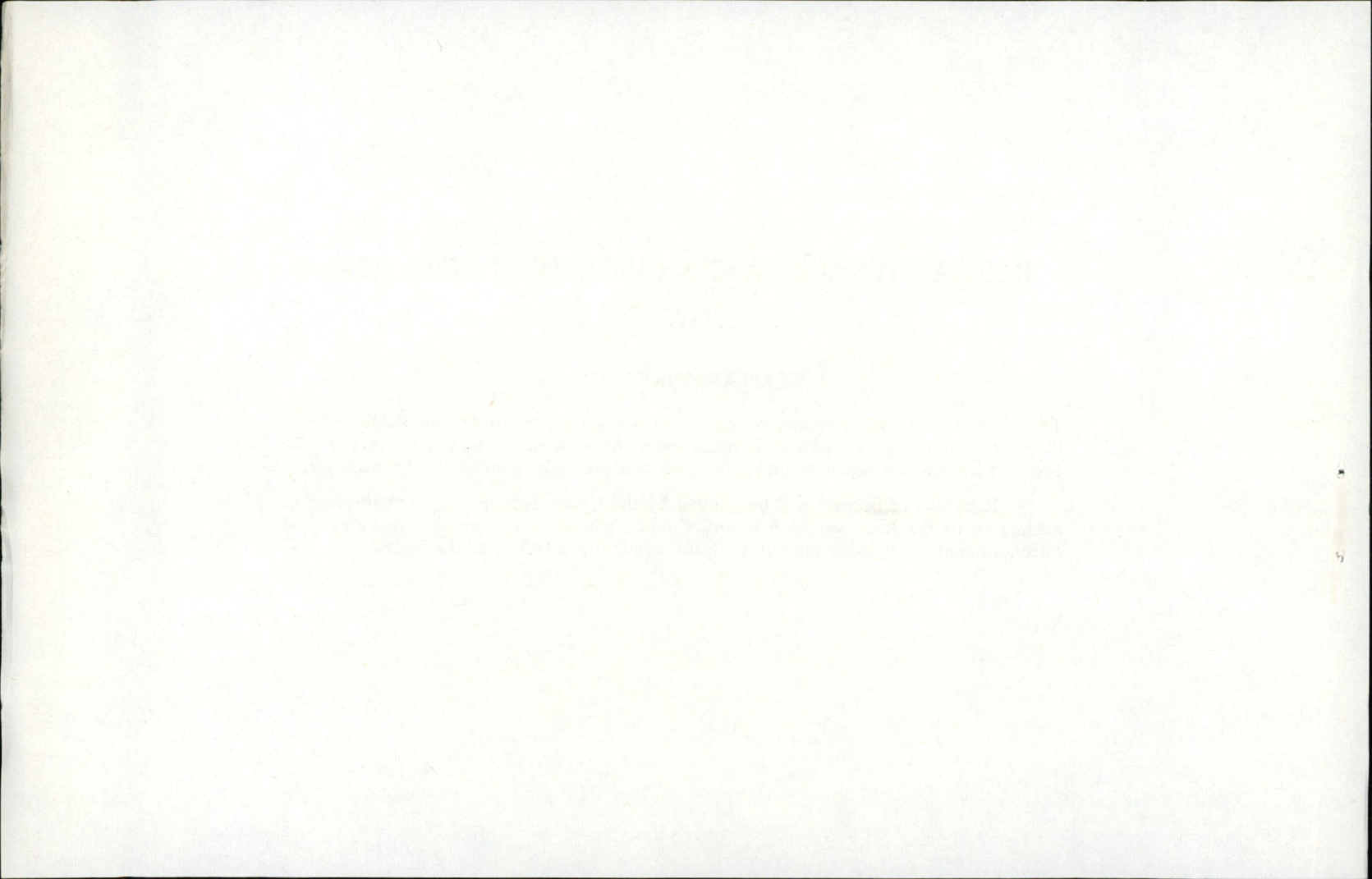

RADIOACTIVE SUBSTANCES (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1967

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE object of this Bill is to enable the Under Secretary, Department of Public Health, to grant licenses and renewals of licenses under the Radioactive Substances Act, 1957-1965. Licenses and renewals under that Act are presently granted by the Minister.

Renewals of licenses will be granted by the Under Secretary without the recommendation of the Radiological Advisory Council where such renewal is to be granted unconditionally or without alteration of any conditions attached to the license.
