

An Act to make provisions with respect to certain trusts for the advancement of education; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows : --

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Technical Educa- short title, tion Trust Funds Act, 1967".

(2) This Act shall commence upon a day to be appointed by the Governor and notified by proclamation published in the Gazette.

2. In this Act, unless the context or subject-matter Interpreta-5 otherwise indicates or requires—

"appointed day" means the day on which this Act commences;

"award" means an award of a prize, medal or scholarship, or a grant or donation, made for the purposes of substituted trusts and includes any like award for those purposes;

"by-laws" means by-laws made under this Act;

"educational establishment" means-

- (a) a technical college conducted by the Department of Technical Education;
- (b) The New South Wales Institute of Technology;
- (c) The New South Wales Institute of Business Studies; or

(d) any college, institute or other educational body that is declared by the Governor, by notification published in the Gazette, to be an educational establishment for the purposes of this Act;

- "Fund" means a Fund named in the First Column of the Schedule that, before the appointed day, was held upon the trusts created by the trust instrument described in that Column in relation to that Fund;
 - "notified office" means an office specified in an order published under section three or six of this Act and for the time being in force;
 - "prescribed" means prescribed by this Act or the by-laws;

"Schedule"

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"Schedule" means Schedule to this Act;

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"substituted trusts" in relation to a Fund means the trusts specified in the Second Column of the Schedule opposite the name of the Fund in the First Column of the Schedule;

"trust instrument" means an instrument described in the First Column of the Schedule.

3. (1) The persons for the time being holding the two Statutory or more offices specified by the Governor, by order published Trustees.
10 in the Gazette for the purposes of this section or section six of this Act and for the time being in force shall, subject to this Act, be the trustees (in this Act referred to as Statutory Trustees) of the Fund or Funds specified in the order and, as such trustees, shall be known by a designation also so specified.

(2) A certificate, purporting to have been signed by the Secretary of the Department of Technical Education, to the effect that a person specified in the certificate is a Statutory Trustee for the time being of a Fund so specified shall, without proof of the signature or of the official capacity of the person purporting to have signed the certificate and whether or not the person purporting to have signed the certificate is a Statutory Trustee of that Fund, be accepted in all courts and by all persons as evidence of the facts stated therein.

(3) For the purpose only of making an order pursuant to subsection one of this section and of any matters necessary for or incidental to making such an order, that subsection shall be deemed to have commenced on the day on which this Act receives the Royal Assent, but shall not commence
30 for all purposes until the appointed day.

(4) An order made pursuant to subsection one of this section before the appointed day shall, notwithstanding anything contained in section twelve of this Act, take effect on the appointed day.

4. (1) On the appointed day—

- Dissolution
- (a) the trusts, terms and conditions upon which a Fund of trusts and creation of was held immediately before that day shall, except substituted trusts. to the extent that the operation of any of them is continued by or under this Act, cease to have any force or effect;
- (b) a person who, immediately before that day, held office as trustee of a Fund shall vacate that office and shall be discharged and freed from the trusts, agreements or declarations created, entered into or made by the trust instrument relating to that Fund;
- (c) any provision of a trust instrument relating to the appointment of new trustees or the retirement of trustees shall cease to have effect; and
- (d) the substituted trusts relating to a Fund shall, subject to subsection two of this section, become the trusts to which that Fund is subject.

(2) The capital of a Fund shall be held upon trust to invest the same in the manner permitted by the Trustee Act, 20 1925, as amended by subsequent Acts.

5. (1) On the day on which a person becomes a Appoint-Statutory Trustee, either by assuming a notified office or by ment and being the holder of an office that becomes a notified office, of Statutory he shall be deemed to have been duly appointed as a trustee Trustees. 25 of a Fund specified in the order specifying the notified office.

(2) A Statutory Trustee shall—

- (a) on the day on which he ceases to hold a notified office; or
- (b) on the day on which an office held by him ceases to be a notified office,

vacate his office as trustee of a Fund and shall be discharged from the trusts of that Fund.

(3) Subject to subsection four of this section, a Fund that, immediately before the appointed day, was vested in 35 trustees who vacate office pursuant to paragraph (b) of section four of this Act shall, from time to time and without any conveyance or other assurance, vest in the Statutory Trustees

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Trustees for the time being of that Fund, as joint tenants, for the purposes of this Act and the substituted trusts relating to that Fund.

(4) Where the number of persons holding office as5 Statutory Trustees of a particular Fund is reduced to less than two, the Fund shall, without any conveyance or other assurance, vest—

- (a) where, from any cause other than the death of a Statutory Trustee, there is only one Statutory Trustee of the Fund, in that Statutory Trustee; or
- (b) where there are no Statutory Trustees of the Fund, in the person who is, or is acting as, the Permanent Head of the Department of Technical Education,

for the purposes of this Act and the substituted trusts relating 15 to that Fund.

(5) A person in whom a Fund is vested pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection four of this section shall be deemed to be a Statutory Trustee of the Fund, but shall vacate that office and shall be discharged from the trusts of that20 Fund upon the assumption of office by a Statutory Trustee

of that Fund, appointed pursuant to subsection one of this section.

(6) The provisions of the Trustee Act, 1925, as amended by subsequent Acts, relating to the appointment of 25 new trustees and the retirement of trustees shall not apply to or in respect of Statutory Trustees.

(3) The Statutory Trustees of a Fund may, in their 25 discretion, determine whether unexpended income from the Fund shall be treated as capital moneys and added to the Fund, or whether it shall be treated as accrued income for the purposes of awards from the Fund.

8. (1) Statutory Trustees who are trustees of more than Common 30 one Fund may establish, and carry to the credit of, a common trust fund. trust fund any capital moneys of, or income from, the Funds of which they are trustees.

(2) Where a common trust fund is established pursuant to this section, the Statutory Trustees shall keep, or cause to be kept, proper books of account showing the amount for the time being at credit in the common trust 5 fund on account of each contributing Fund.

(3) Moneys in a common trust fund shall not be credited thereto in the name or on account of any particular Fund but any interest or other profits thereon shall be shared proportionately according to the amount contributed by each 10 Fund to the common trust fund and the period for which the contribution formed part of the common trust fund.

(4) The charges relating to the keeping of a common trust fund shall be borne by each contributing Fund in such manner and to such extent as the Statutory Trustees of the 15 contributing Funds may from time to time in their discretion decide.

(5) The Statutory Trustees of the contributing Funds may withdraw money from a common trust fund for the purposes of the trusts reposed in them by this Act.

(i) empowering the Statutory Trustees to determine matters relating to awards in accordance with their opinion, or at their discretion, or to direct the manner in which such matters may be determined;

(i) empowering the Statutory Trustees to determine the terms and conditions on which, or the purposes for which, a scholarship may be awarded or an award by virtue of section thirteen of this Act, a grant or a donation may be made.

(3) A by-law may be general or particular in its application and its application may vary according to time, place or circumstance,

(4) When making a by-law, Statutory Trustees shall 25 certify that they have had regard to the intentions of the donor of the Fund to which the by-law relates, as expressed by the trust instrument relating to that Fund.

(5) The by-laws shall-

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- (a) be submitted for the approval of the Governor;
- (b) if approved by the Governor, be published in the Gazette:

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
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


TECHNICAL EDUCATION TRUST FUNDS BILL, 1967

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE objects of this Bill are-

- (a) to enable Funds constituted for the purpose of awarding prizes, medals or scholarships to students in certain technical education courses and The University of New South Wales to be vested in the holders for the time being of certain offices, as trustees, without the necessity for registering deeds of appointment and retirement of trustees from time to time;
- (b) to substitute for the trusts, terms and conditions upon which those Funds were constituted other trusts, terms and conditions as nearly as possible resembling the original trusts, terms and conditions, having regard to changes in courses and other changed circumstances since the Funds were originally constituted;
- (c) to enable the Governor to bring within the operation of the Act future gifts or bequests constituting similar Funds;





B^E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Technical Educa-Short title, citation and trust Funds Act, 1967".





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

by any law now or hereafter in force relating to the audit of public accounts; and the Audit Act, 1902, as amended by subsequent Acts, shall apply to the Statutory Trustees in the same manner as it applies to accounting officers of public departments.

12. An order made by the Governor for the purposes of any of the provisions of this Act shall take effect upon the day on which it is published in the Gazette or, where some later day is specified in the order for the purpose, on that later day.

13. (1) Where, in the opinion of the Statutory Trustees of a Fund, the income of the Fund is more than sufficient for the purposes of the substituted trusts relating to that Fund, those trustees may expend the surplus income for the advancement of education as prescribed by by-laws relating to such income.

(2) Any income expended pursuant to subsection one of this section shall be deemed to have been applied for the purposes of the substituted trusts relating to the Fund.

By-laws.

14. (1) Statutory Trustees may, in relation to a Fund of which they are trustees, make by-laws not inconsistent with this Act or the substituted trusts relating to that Fund, for or with respect to all matters or things that by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed or that are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for giving effect to this Act and those substituted trusts.

(2) Without limiting the generality of subsection one of this section, Statutory Trustees of a Fund may make by-laws referred to in that subsection for or with respect to—

- (a) prescribing the terms and conditions upon which awards may be made;
- (b) determining eligibility for awards;

(c)

- (c) prescribing the courses, subjects or fields in respect of which, and the stages at which, an award may be made;
- (d) specifying the purposes for which an award may be utilised;
- (e) prescribing the educational establishment at which the conditions governing an award may be fulfilled;
- (f) prescribing the form of an award;
- (g) prescribing the time at which an award may be made;
- (h) the expenditure of surplus income pursuant to section thirteen of this Act;
- (i) empowering the Statutory Trustees to determine matters relating to awards in accordance with their opinion, or at their discretion, or to direct the manner in which such matters may be determined;
- (j) empowering the Statutory Trustees to determine the terms and conditions on which, or the purposes for which, a scholarship may be awarded or an award by virtue of section thirteen of this Act, a grant or a donation may be made.

(3) A by-law may be general or particular in its application and its application may vary according to time, place or circumstance,

(4) When making a by-law, Statutory Trustees shall certify that they have had regard to the intentions of the donor of the Fund to which the by-law relates, as expressed by the trust instrument relating to that Fund.

(5) The by-laws shall—

- (a) be submitted for the approval of the Governor;
- (b) if approved by the Governor, be published in the Gazette;

- (c) take effect from the day of publication in the Gazette or from a later day specified in the by-laws for the purpose;
- (d) be laid before both Houses of Parliament within fourteen sitting days after publication if Parliament is then in session, and if not, then within fourteen sitting days after the commencement of the next session.

(6) If either House of Parliament passes a resolution of which notice has been given at any time within fifteen sitting days after the by-laws have been laid before such House disallowing any by-law or part thereof, such by-law or part shall thereupon cease to have effect.
