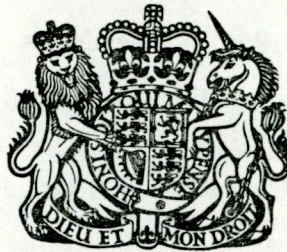

An Act to make further provisions with respect to the granting of school certificates and higher school certificates; for this and other purposes to amend the Education Act, 1961; to validate certain matters; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

EDUCATION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1968

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to provide that school certificates and higher school certificates shall be granted only to persons who, as pupils of certain schools, have complied with the requirements prescribed for the grant of those certificates;
- (b) to provide for the registration of certain schools submitting candidates for the Higher School Certificate Examination;
- (c) to empower the Board of Senior School Studies to determine, without making by-laws, the requirements for the grant of higher school certificates as to examinations to be passed and standards of pass; and
- (d) to make other provisions of a minor or ancillary character.
