BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "St. Anne's Church of England, Ryde, Act, 1968".

20 less than two weeks in a newspaper or newspapers published in Sydney and circulating widely throughout New South Wales.

(3) At any time after the appearance of the first advertisement referred to in subsection two of this section and
25 before the expiration of three months from the appearance of the last of those advertisements, the representatives or any persons claiming to be the representatives of any person who is buried in the cemetery land or whose ashes have been placed in or on that land may, at their own expense, and
30 with the permission of the Trust, remove any monument or other surface structure that is upon the cemetery land and relates to that person, and may, at their own expense, and with the permission of the Director-General of Public Health, remove to such cemetery for burial, or such crematorium for
35 cremation, as they desire, the remains of that person.

- (a) where practicable, re-erect the monuments and other surface structures collected under subsection one of section five of this Act in a memorial court established for the purpose on part of the land described in the Schedule to this Act; or
- (b) where it is not so practicable, otherwise dispose of such monuments or other surface structures as the Trust may approve.

Remains not

7. (1) The Trust or any person authorised as aforesaid or any person shall take due care not to unearth or disturb the remains of any person who is buried in, or any article containing the ashes of any person which has been placed in or on, the cemetery land.

(2) If any such remains or such articles are unearthed or disturbed, the Trust or the person authorised as aforesaid shall cause—

- (a) such remains to be reverently interred in some other part of the land described in the Schedule to this Act, or in another cemetery; or
- (b) such articles to be reverently placed in or on some other part of such land or in or on some other cemetery.

(3) Nothing in this section prevents the removal of any remains pursuant to subsection three of section five of this Act.

8. No compensation shall be payable to any person in respect of the performance of any act authorised by this Act.

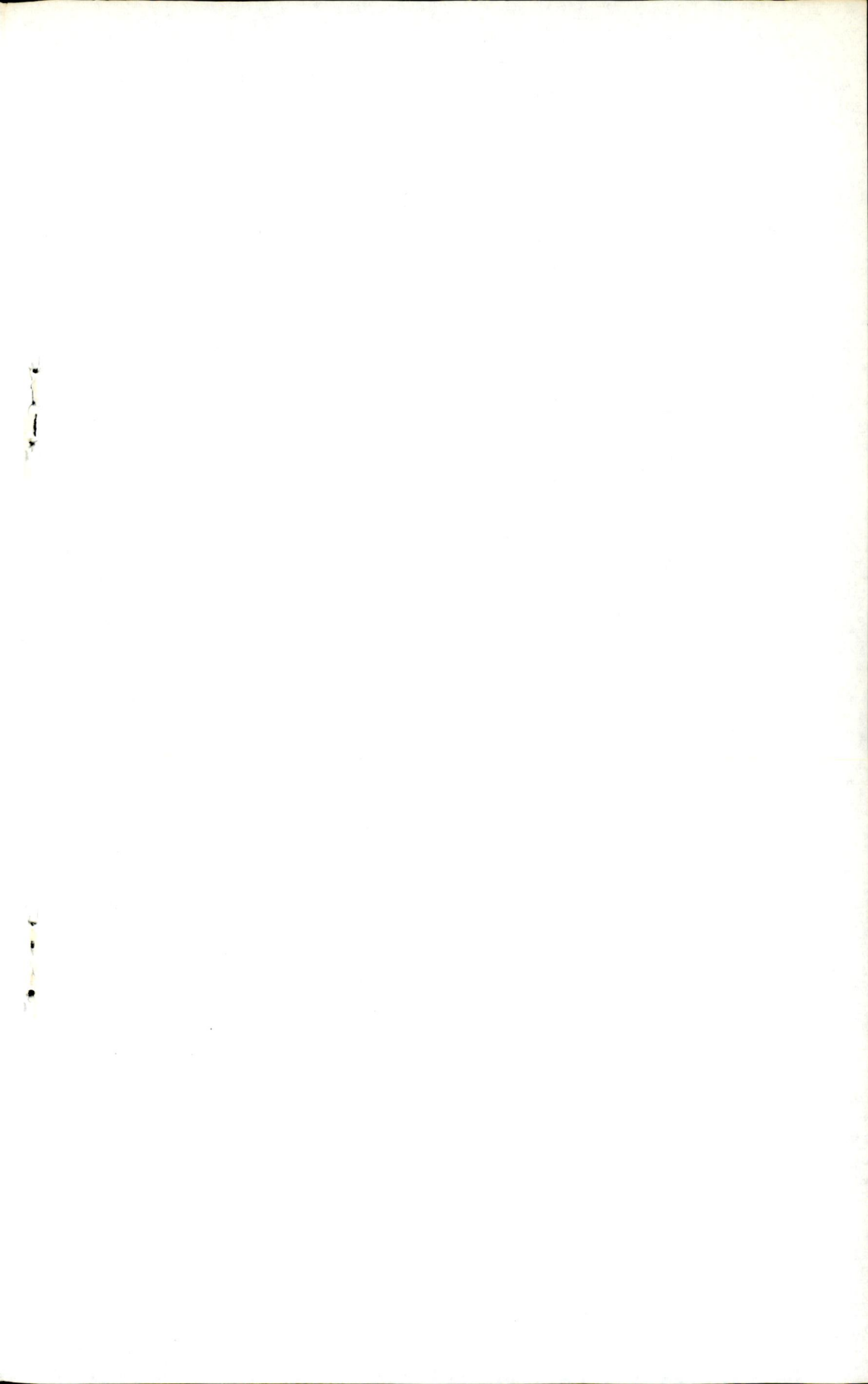

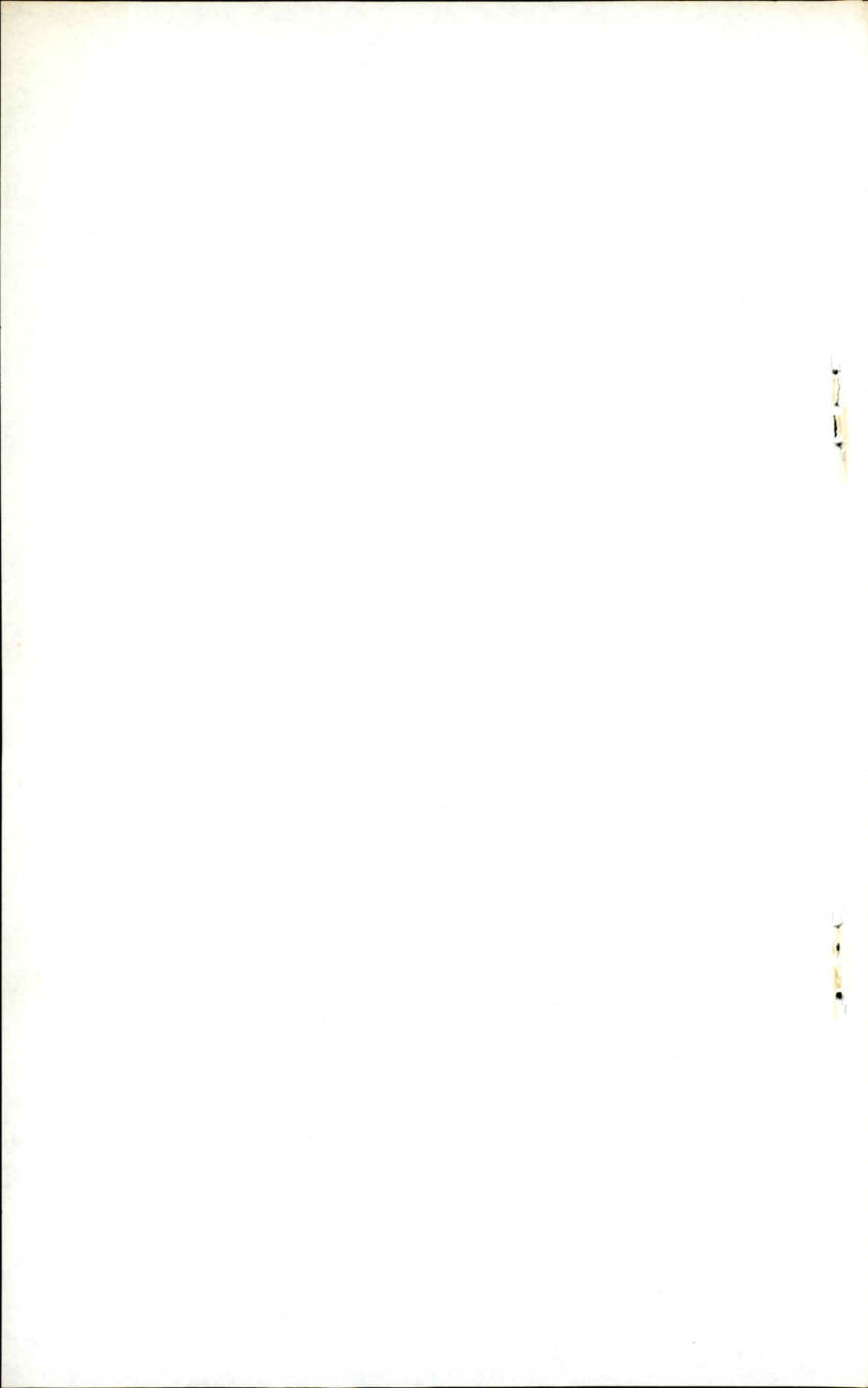

An Act to authorise the use of cemetery land attached to St. Anne's Church of England at Ryde for the erection of extensions to that Church and certain other purposes associated with that Church; to repeal the St. Anne's Church of England, Ryde, Act, 1953; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 5th December, 1968.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "St. Anne's Church of England, Ryde, Act, 1968". Short title.

Repeal. **2.** The St. Anne's Church of England, Ryde, Act, 1953, is hereby repealed.

**Interpre-
tation.** **3.** In this Act, unless the context or subject-matter otherwise indicates or requires—

“the cemetery land” means such part of the land described in the Schedule to this Act as was, immediately before the commencement of this Act, owned by the Trust and used as a cemetery;

“the Trust” means the Church of England Property Trust Diocese of Sydney.

4. It shall be lawful for the Trust or such persons as may be authorised by the Trust to use the cemetery land for the erection of extensions to St. Anne's Church of England at Ryde, and the construction of footpaths, driveways and car parking areas and such other purposes of the St. Anne's Church of England at Ryde, as the Trust may determine, notwithstanding—

- (a) that, immediately before the commencement of this Act, the cemetery land comprised a cemetery; and
- (b) any trusts, conditions, encumbrances or dedications affecting the cemetery land immediately before the commencement of this Act.

**Removal of

etc.**

5. (1) Before any use is made of the cemetery land pursuant to section four of this Act, the Trust or the persons authorised as aforesaid shall—

- (a) cause a register to be compiled of the names and other relevant information in respect of persons who are buried in or whose ashes have been placed in or on the cemetery land, so far as those names and that information can by reasonable diligence be obtained, and deposit and maintain the register at

at St. Anne's Church of England at Ryde, so as to be available for inspection by any interested person from time to time;

- (b) furnish a certified copy of the register to the Minister;
- (c) furnish a certified copy of the register to the Mitchell Library, Sydney, where it shall be maintained so as to be available for inspection by any interested person from time to time; and
- (d) subject as hereinafter provided, cause any monuments and other surface structures on the cemetery land to be collected with due care for re-erection or disposal in accordance with this Act.

(2) At least three months before any monuments or other surface structures are collected for re-erection or disposal in accordance with this Act, an advertisement of the intention so to do shall be inserted twice at an interval of not less than two weeks in a newspaper or newspapers published and circulating in the locality, and twice at an interval of not less than two weeks in a newspaper or newspapers published in Sydney and circulating widely throughout New South Wales.

(3) At any time after the appearance of the first advertisement referred to in subsection two of this section and before the expiration of three months from the appearance of the last of those advertisements, the representatives or any persons claiming to be the representatives of any person who is buried in the cemetery land or whose ashes have been placed in or on that land may, at their own expense, and with the permission of the Trust, remove any monument or other surface structure that is upon the cemetery land and relates to that person, and may, at their own expense, and with the permission of the Director-General of Public Health, remove to such cemetery for burial, or such crematorium for cremation, as they desire, the remains of that person.

6. Subject to the provisions of subsections two and three of section five of this Act, the Trust or the persons authorised as aforesaid shall—

- (a) where practicable, re-erect the monuments and other surface structures collected under subsection one of section five of this Act in a memorial court established for the purpose on part of the land described in the Schedule to this Act; or
- (b) where it is not so practicable, otherwise dispose of such monuments or other surface structures as the Trust may approve.

7. (1) The Trust or any person authorised as aforesaid or any person shall take due care not to unearth or disturb the remains of any person who is buried in, or any article containing the ashes of any person which has been placed in or on, the cemetery land.

(2) If any such remains or such articles are unearthed or disturbed, the Trust or the person authorised as aforesaid shall cause—

- (a) such remains to be reverently interred in some other part of the land described in the Schedule to this Act, or in another cemetery; or
- (b) such articles to be reverently placed in or on some other part of such land or in or on some other cemetery.

(3) Nothing in this section prevents the removal of any remains pursuant to subsection three of section five of this Act.

8. No compensation shall be payable to any person in respect of the performance of any act authorised by this Act.
