1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Statutory Salaries Adjustment Act, 1968".

Short title and commencement.

(2) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight.

The salary payable to the holder of an office specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Act pursuant to the enactment specified opposite that office in the second column of that Schedule is hereby increased to the amount specified opposite that office in the third column of that Schedule.
