An Act to make further provisions with respect to the labelling of textile products; for this purpose to amend the Textile Products Labelling Act, 1954, as amended by the Decimal Currency Act, 1965; and for purposes connected therewith.

**B**E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

**1.** (1) This Act may be cited as the "Textile Products Labelling (Amendment) Act, 1968".

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## TEXTILE PRODUCTS LABELLING (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1968

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### EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to enable a textile product containing at least 80 per cent. of sheep's wool and at least 95 per cent. of a mixture of such wool and one or more of certain specialty animal fibres to be labelled "pure wool" or "all wool";
- (b) to enable a textile product containing at least 95 per cent. of sheep's wool to be labelled "all wool" as an alternative to "pure wool", the labelling at present prescribed; and
- (c) to include carpets in the definition of "Textile products".
