WINDAMERE DAM BILL, 1970

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Bill sanctions and provides for the construction of—

- (a) a dam across the Cudgegong River about 14 miles south-east of the town of Mudgee of a height sufficient to store about 280,000 acre-feet of water for irrigation purposes;
- (b) necessary spillway and outlet works for regulation of the discharge of water from the storage.

The Bill provides that the work shall be deemed an authorised work within the meaning of the Public Works Act, 1912, and that The Water Conservation and Irrigation Commission shall be the Constructing Authority for the work.

The estimated cost of the work is twelve million dollars.
