The object of this Bill is to amend the Cigarettes and Cigarette Papers Act, 1954, so as to provide for the labelling of cigarettes and cigarette papers, and to provide for the issue of licences to persons who are engaged in the business of manufacturing or selling cigarettes or cigarette papers, and to provide for the issue of licences to persons who are engaged in the business of manufacturing or selling cigarette papers.
