An Act to enable annual practising fees to be made payable by different registered nurses and enrolled nursing aides at different times; for this purpose to amend the Nurses Registration Act, 1953; and for purposes connected therewith.

THE objects of this Bill are to enable the times for payment of annual practising fees payable by registered nurses and enrolled nursing aides to be staggered and to make other provisions of an ancillary character.
