SWINE COMPENSATION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1972

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to repeal the Swine Compensation Taxation Act, 1928, and certain other enactments;
- (b) to provide that where a diseased pig is destroyed the amount payable from the Swine Compensation Fund shall be nine-tenths, instead of seven-eighths, of its market value;
- (c) to restrict payments of compensation from that Fund in cases in which, at the time of purchase, it was known or should reasonably have been suspected that a pig was suffering from disease;
- (d) to provide for investment of Fund moneys not immediately required for the purposes of the Fund and for the use of those moneys to finance research into diseases of pigs or problems affecting pig production;
- (e) to increase penalties for—
 - (i) trafficking in diseased pigs or carcasses with a view to compensation; and
 - (ii) making charges for insurance or indemnity against losses on sale of pigs,
from two hundred dollars to five hundred dollars;
- (f) to increase the penalty where none is specifically provided for an offence under the Act or regulations from forty dollars to one hundred and fifty dollars;
- (g) to validate certain payments made from the Swine Compensation Fund; and
- (h) to make other provisions of a consequential or ancillary nature.
