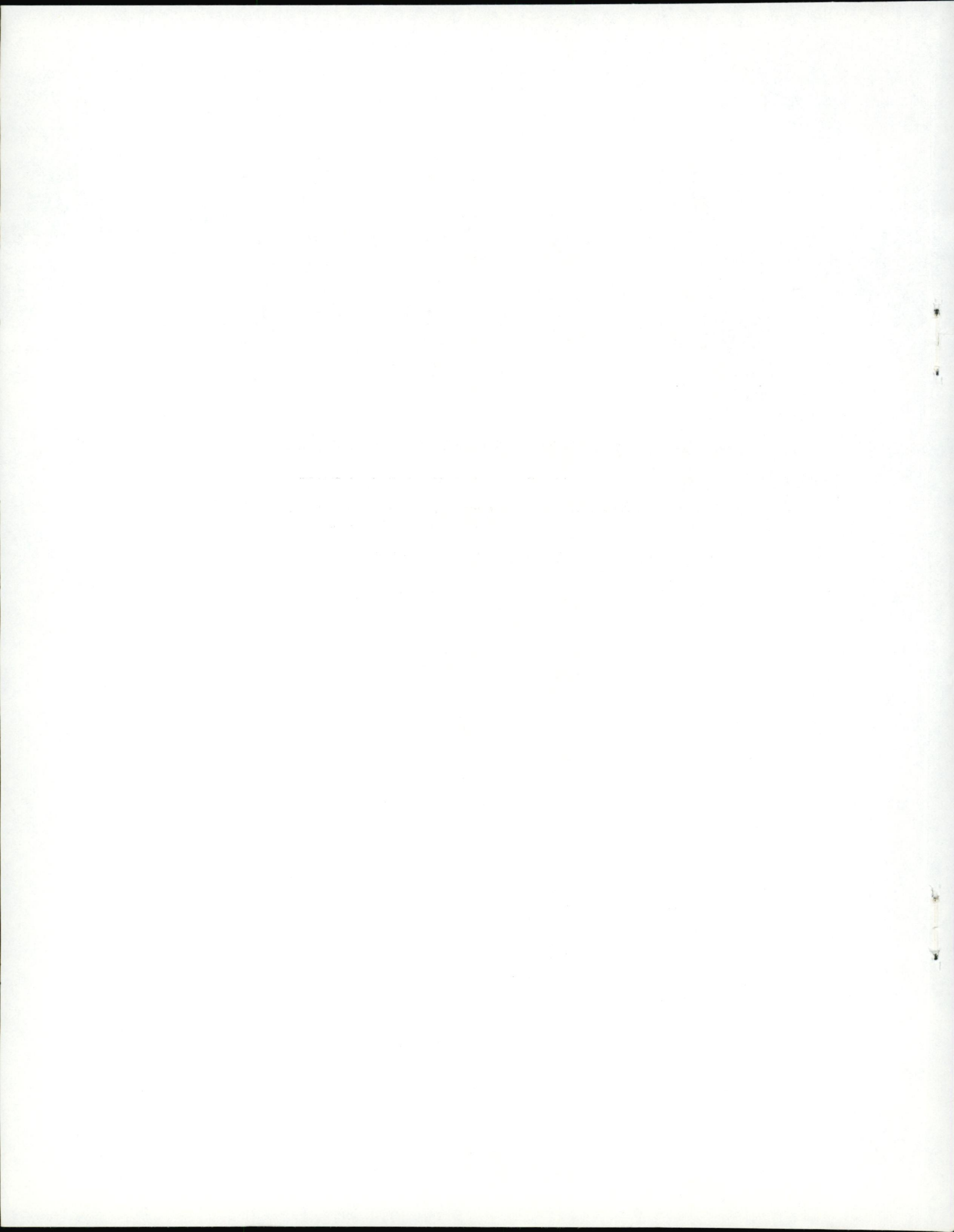

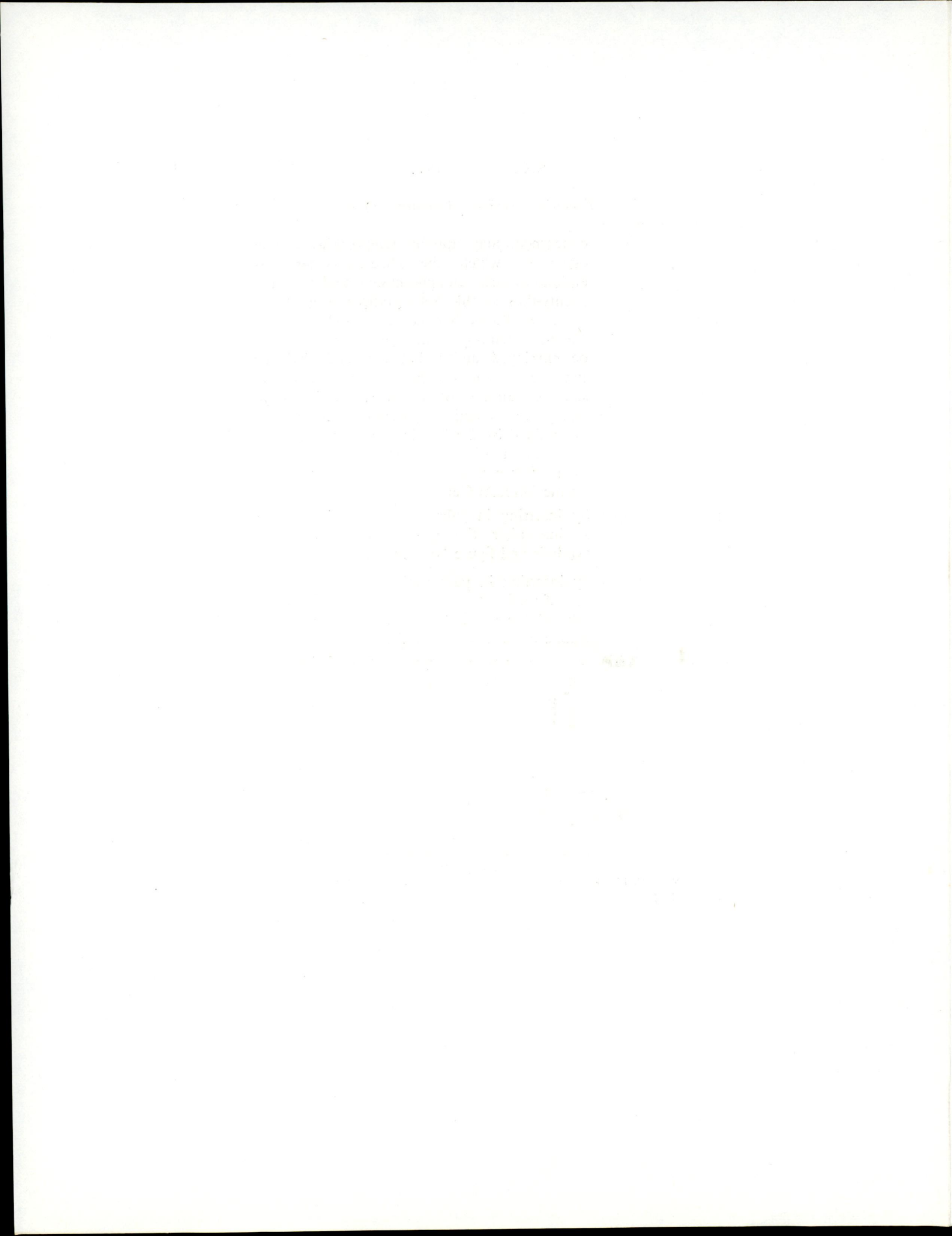

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to exclude from the powers of the Director-General of Education under section 17 of the Teaching Service Act, 1970, the power to determine the academic staff establishments of teachers' colleges that are colleges of advanced education;
- (b) to make provisions with respect to the transfer of persons employed under the Public Service Act, 1902, to the Teaching Service;
- (c) to enable certain senior officers of the Public Service to be appointed to a promotions committee constituted under the Teaching Service Act, 1970;
- (d) to make other provisions of a minor or ancillary nature.

Section 1

Every person who is appointed to any office in this State shall be a citizen of the United States and shall have resided in this State for a period of one year immediately preceding his appointment. The Governor may, in his discretion, waive this requirement in the case of any person who has resided in this State for a period of six months immediately preceding his appointment and who has been domiciled in this State for a period of one year immediately preceding his appointment.
