ARTICLE 1

Section 1. The purpose of this organization shall be to promote the welfare of the community and to provide for the education and training of its members.

Section 2. The members of this organization shall be those persons who have been admitted to membership in accordance with the provisions of this constitution.

Section 3. The officers of this organization shall be elected annually at a general meeting of the members and shall hold office until the next annual meeting.

Section 4. The property of this organization shall be held in trust for the benefit of the members and shall not be alienated or disposed of in any manner without the approval of a majority of the members.

Section 5. This constitution may be amended or revised by a majority vote of the members at a general meeting called for that purpose.

Section 6. This constitution shall be binding on all members of this organization and shall be subject to the provisions of any laws or regulations of the state.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to provide that the adoption of annual estimates of probable expenditure from the Argentine Ant Eradication Campaign Fund is conditional upon the agreement of the Treasurer;
- (b) to require any credit balance held in the Fund at the end of a financial year to be deducted from the amount of contributions to the Fund assessed for the next financial year;
- (c) to remove the statutory limit of \$30,000 on the annual total of contributions by the Treasurer and councils to the Fund;
- (d) to validate certain assessments of contributions to the Fund; and
- (e) to make provisions of a consequential or ancillary nature.

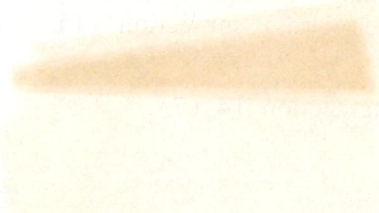
