A BILL

To make provision for the protection of Bungonia Gorge and environs by revocation of Special Mining Lease Number SL639(06) and by the limitation of limestone mining activities; to make provision for the restoration and revegetation of areas affected by mining; and for purposes connected therewith.

5 **B**E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

(2) Failure by the lessee to comply with either of the conditions specified in subsection (1) shall be an offence against this Act and the lessee shall be liable, on summary

4. (1) Associated Portland Cement Manufacturers (Australia) Limited shall cause areas as are outside the boundaries of the leases referred to in section 3 and are affected by spillage emanating from mining operations within the boundaries of such leases, to be revegetated at such time and in such manner as the President for the time being of the National Trust of Australia (New South Wales) directs by notice in writing delivered to such company at its registered office.
