EXPLANATORY NOTE

1.	Clause	1	specifies	the	short	title	of	the	Bill.	
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- 2. Clause 2 is a commencement provision.
- 3. Clause 3 is an interpretation provision.
- 4. Clause 4 amends the Principal Act-
 - (a) in the definition of "small shop" in section 76A, by amending the reference to the Schedule which specifies the categories of goods that may be sold in a small shop;
 - (b) by omitting certain definitions, made unnecessary by the amendments contained in this Bill, from section 78;


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

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
