**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

THE objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to omit references to “boy” in the Mines Inspection Act, 1901 (Schedules 1, 3, 5);
  - (b) to remove the restriction on the quantum of the fee that the Minister may fix in respect of the issue of certain certificates (Schedule 2);
  - (c) to restrict the employment of persons under the age of 16 years in and about mines (Schedule 3 (1));
  - (d) to specify the occupations in which women may engage below ground in a mine (Schedule 3 (1));
  - (e) to prohibit a person under the age of 18 years from being employed in caging operations (Schedule 3 (1));
  - (f) to dispense with the keeping of a register of boys employed in and about a mine (Schedule 3 (2));
  - (g) to provide that appointments of inspectors of mines are made under and subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1902 (Schedules 1 (2), 4 (1));
  - (h) to provide for a summary of reports of inspectors of mines to be included in the annual report of the Department of Mines and to remove the requirement for the report made by each inspector to the Chief Inspector to be included in that annual report (Schedule 4 (3)); and
  - (i) to amend the General Rules contained in section 55 of the Mines Inspection Act, 1901, relating to—
    - (i) the persons who may use explosives in a mine (Schedule 5 (1), (4)); and
    - (ii) the showering and toilet facilities to be provided at a mine (Schedule 5 (2)).
