1. This Act may be cited as the "Port Macquarie Short title. Entrance Improvement Works Act, 1976".

(2) The site of the scheduled works is shown on the plan marked "Port Macquarie Entrance Improvement" signed by the Minister, countersigned by the Director of 15 Public Works and deposited in the public office of the Minister.

3. (1) The carrying out of the scheduled works is hereby Scheduled works sanctioned.

(2) The Minister is empowered to carry out the 20 scheduled works and for the purpose of so doing may do all such things, including entering into contracts, as he may consider necessary.

- (b) associated works as may be deemed necessary or desirable by the Minister; and
- (c) works for the protection of the environment as may be deemed necessary or desirable by the Minister as a consequence of the works referred to in paragraph (a) or (b).
