(2) The holder of an office referred to in subsection (1) is not entitled to the recreation leave allowance referred to in that subsection in respect of the year ending on 30th November, 1975, if he has been paid a recreation leave allowance in respect of that year under section 4 of the Statutory Salaries Adjustment Act, 1974.

Repeal of Act No. 8, 1974. 5. The Statutory Salaries Adjustment Act, 1974, is hereby repealed.
