THE objects of this Bill are, in the event of the Constitution and Parliamentary Electorates and Elections (Amendment) Bill, 1977, being passed by both Houses of Parliament—

- (a) to appoint—
    - (i) subject to subparagraph (ii)—10th June, 1978; or
    - (ii) where that day is a day on which a Commonwealth election or referendum is to be held—17th June, 1978,  
as the day for the taking of the vote on the submission of that Bill to the electors at a referendum; and
  - (b) to prescribe the manner in which the vote of the electors at the referendum shall be taken.

The first strike was in 1902, when the coal miners of the United Mine Workers of America (UMWA) went on strike against the coal companies. This was the first time that a union had successfully organized a strike in the United States. The strike lasted for several months and ended in a settlement that recognized the right of miners to join a union.

Another major strike occurred in 1913, when the Pullman porters went on strike. The Pullman Company, which owned the Pullman Palace Cars, was a major employer of African American men. The strike was led by George F. Johnson and lasted for several weeks. It was one of the first strikes led by African Americans and it resulted in the recognition of the Pullman Porter Union.

The 1920s saw a number of other strikes, including the 1920 strike by the International Brotherhood of Teamsters (IBT) and the 1922 strike by the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America (UBCA). These strikes were part of a larger movement for workers' rights and unionization.

The 1930s were a period of intense labor unrest. The 1934 strike by the International Longshoremen's Association (ILA) was one of the most significant strikes of the decade. It was a general strike that affected the entire West Coast and it resulted in the recognition of the ILA as the bargaining agent for longshoremen.

The 1940s saw the rise of the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) and the passage of the National Labor Relations Act (NLRA). These laws gave workers the right to join a union and to bargain collectively with their employers. This led to a period of rapid union growth and to the passage of many other labor laws.
