The objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to provide that, where any person is, by any conviction or order, adjudged to pay any fine, penalty, sum of money or costs in respect of an offence against the Egg Industry Stabilisation Act, 1971, that person shall not be liable to imprisonment in default of payment but the amount shall be recoverable as a debt in a court of petty sessions (Schedule 1);
 - (b) to enable inspectors under the Act, in support of their existing powers to enter, search and inspect premises, to obtain search warrants to enter premises (not being premises used for residential purposes) for the purpose of exercising certain powers, authorities, duties and functions under the Act (Schedule 2); and

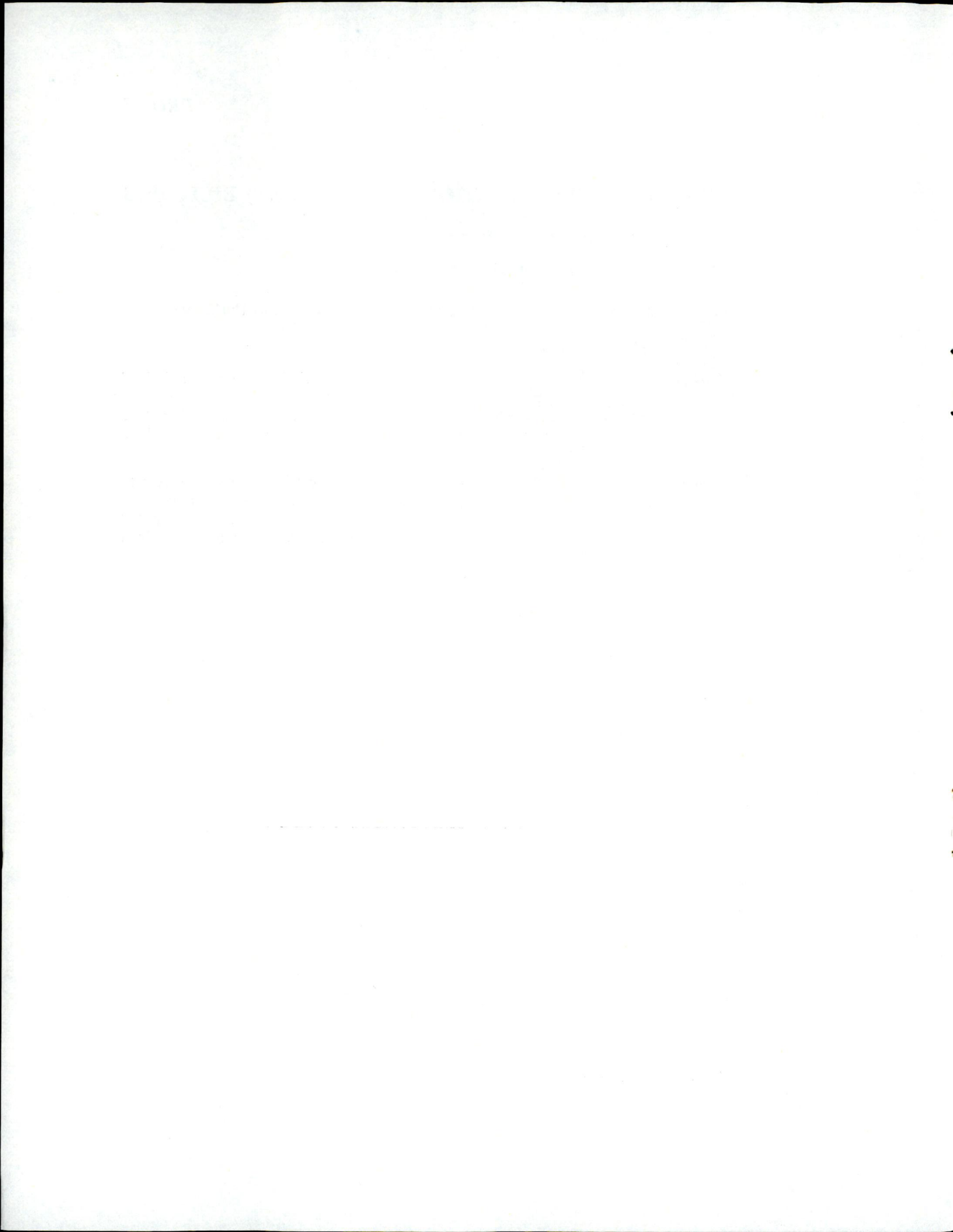
