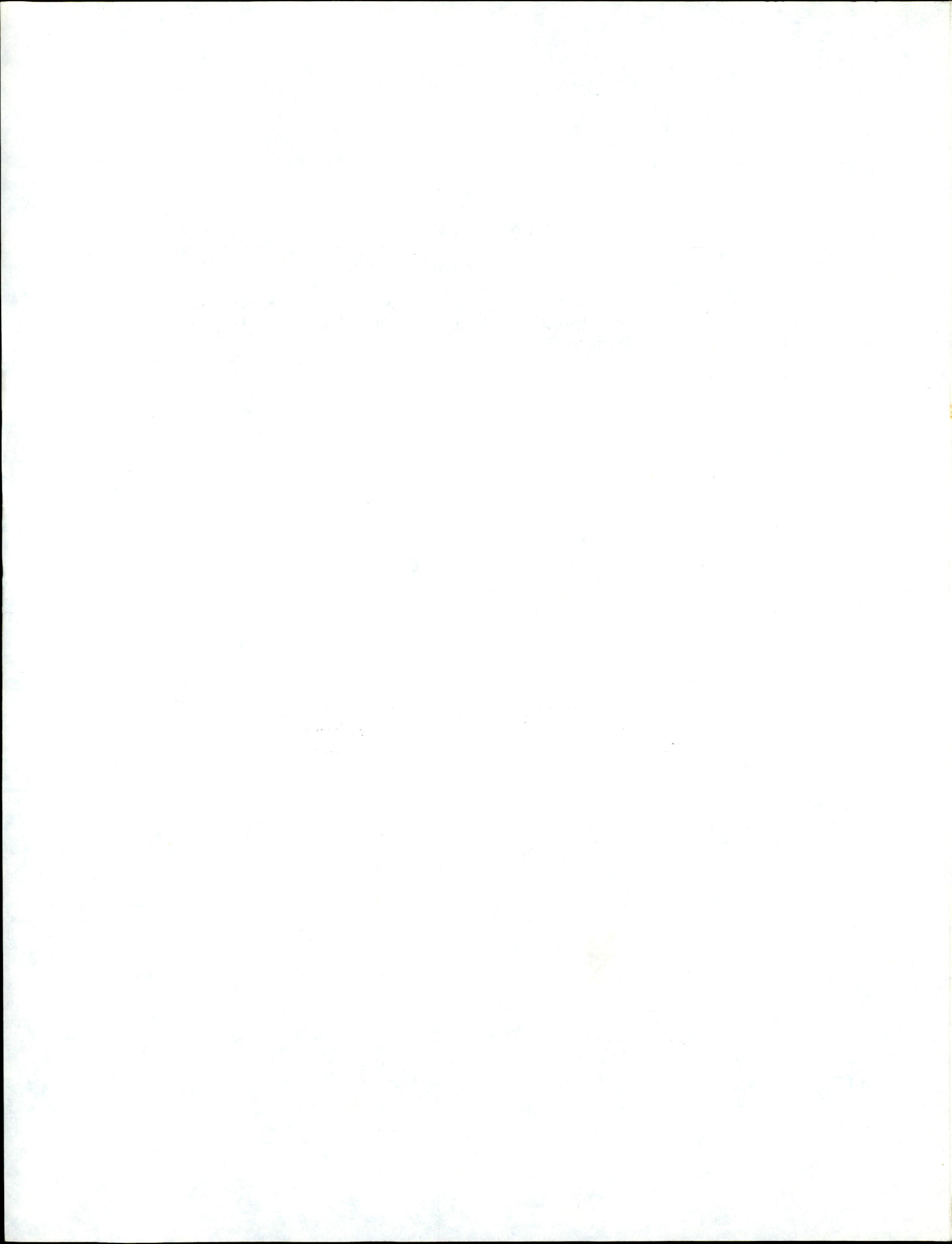

GAMING AND BETTING (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1976

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE object of this Bill is to accord to persons between the ages of 18 and 21 years the same status as persons 21 years of age or over with respect to their using or operating poker machines in clubs registered under the Gaming and Betting Act, 1912, and their joining those clubs.
