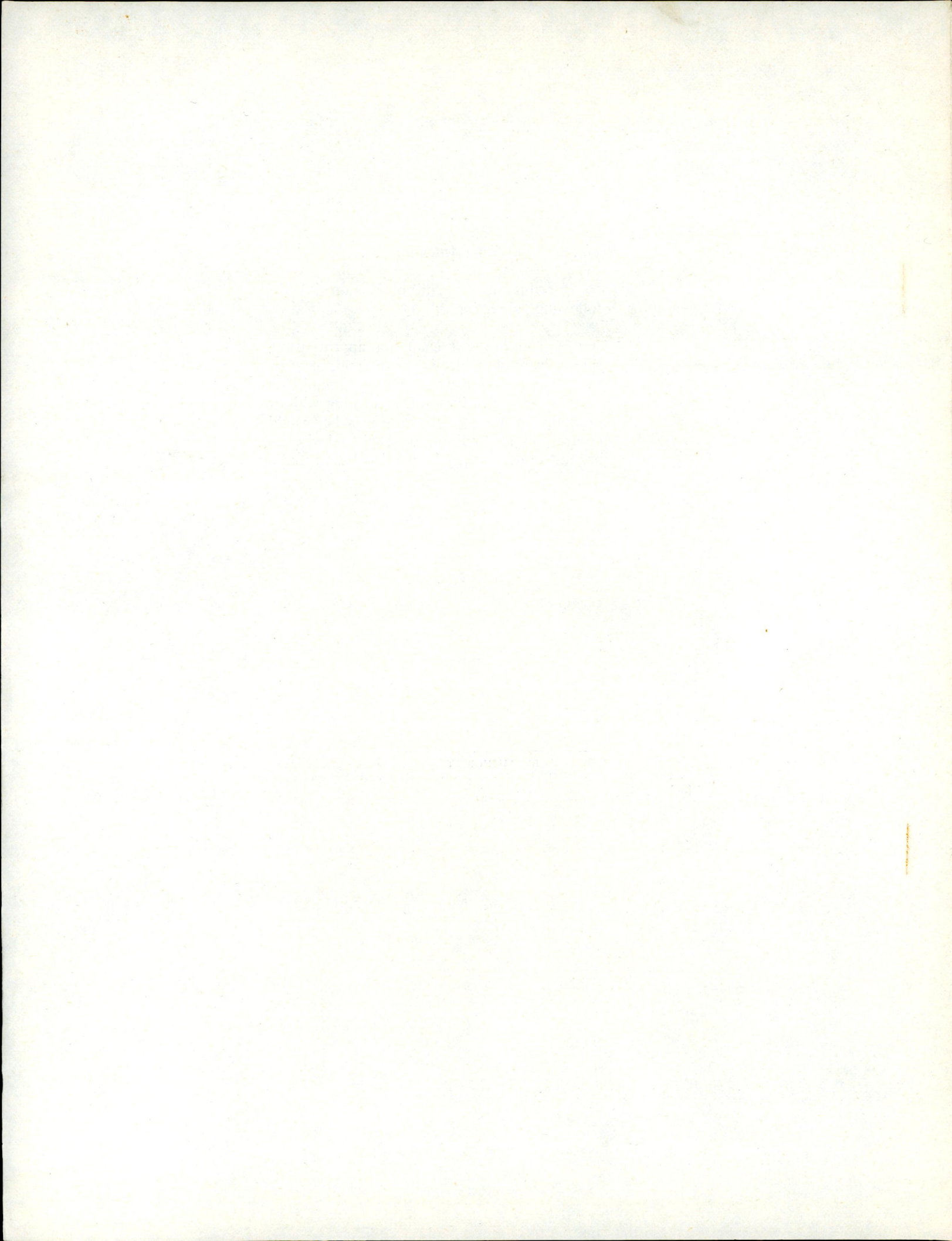

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE object of this Bill is to amend the Health Commission Act, 1972—

- (a) to specify more particularly what is an ambulance service; and
 - (b) to enable the Health Commission of New South Wales to acquire property by gift, devise or bequest but to limit its power to dispose of an interest in land given, devised or bequeathed to it subject to a condition.

Wetland Conservation (Amendment)

(1) In exercising its powers under section 30 of the Act, the Commission may, in relation to any land to which the Act applies, require the owner of the land to do any of the following things:
