- (b) to vary the provisions relating to the minimum ages for employment of persons in or about mines (Schedule 1 (3));
- (c) to provide for the keeping and production of records of persons under the age of 18 years employed or working in mines below ground (Schedule 1 (4)); and
- (d) to provide a penalty for breach of the provisions referred to in paragraph (c) (Schedule 1 (5)).
