B^E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Poisons (Amendment) Act, 1977".

(2) Nothing in subsection (1) affects a decision of the District Court of New South Wales referred to in Schedule 4.

6. A license issued under section 10 (1) of the Poisons Saving— Act, 1966, and in force immediately before the date of assent certain licenses. to this Act shall be deemed to be a license issued under section 10 (1) of the Poisons Act, 1966, as amended by this Act.
